# Meeting support crucial says Boston

Many Whangamata residents were unable to attend the public meeting on March 31 to discuss the Thames Coromandel District Council's Long Term Plan 2021-2031, and future similar meetings will have to address this problem, says Whangamata Ratepayers' Association chairman Rob Boston.

"It was obvious when canvassing support for people to attend the meeting jointly hosted by Grey Power and Ratepayers, that many people were unable to attend due to work and family commitments," he says.

"In the future, options to address must be considered by those organising similar meetings, because it is crucial that the consultation process be inclusive."

"However, the meeting was still attended by over 140 people."

A hearing for submitters to the long term plan began on Tuesday in Thames. It moved to Whitianga on Wednesday before returning to Thames, and was scheduled to end on Friday.

Whangamata residents at the public meeting had emphasised they wanted council-owned property at 101 Lindsay Rd to remain in council hands for the benefit of the local community, and this was relayed to councillors at the hearing, Boston said.

"At the meeting there was considerable debate around the proposed sale of the Thames Coromandel District Councilowned land at 101 Lindsay Road and several speakers supported the establishment of a community hub on the council land, avoiding the sale of the \$3 million property in the Whangamata industrial area."

#### "They noted their

disappointment that the long term plan submission document did not include information regarding a proposed community hub that has been in the pipeline for some time and could be ideally located on the site." The hub proposal had the support of several local voluntary organisations including Community Patrol, Menzshed, Whangamata Lions, the Whangamata Theatre Society and the Arts Collective, Boston added.

"Several preliminary meetings were held, concept sketches produced and budgets prepared. This information was available and could have been included as an option to create further debate.

"A key ingredient for any long term plan should include vision. With the current growth and development in the town, who knows what priorities the Whangamata community will require in 2031?

"Once this land has gone it's gone forever."

A recent Ratepayers' Association newsletter had noted that locals were unable to protect and maintain their own beach and harbour areas because of the restrictive resource consent conditions written up by the Waikato Regional Council regarding mangrove maintenance, Boston said.

These were unworkable in a practical manner, he said, and a submission had been made to the hearing asking why no reference to the ongoing mangrove situation in Whangamata harbour appeared in the long term plan, which the TCDC plans to release early in June.

Meanwhile, the Whangamata Ratepayers' Association, which this year elected a new committee, is continuing on its mission to advance the interests of ratepayers in the town and to preserve, conserve, and enhance its amenities, harbours and estuaries

Boston says this year the ratepayers' association aims to be proactive and will encourage more ratepayers and residents to take an interest in local affairs.

# Submission favours \$330,000 pool grant

The Whangamata Community Board has made a submission to the Thames Coromandel District Council's long term plan for a one-off grant of \$330,000 to pay for improvements to the Whangamata Real Estate Community Pool.

The grant, presented as Option One in the council's Long Term Plan 2021-2031 consultation document, is two-thirds of the total cost of the proposed upgrade and will depend on the community first raising \$167,000.

A story in the second April edition of Whangamata News claimed a submission had been made in favour of Option 2, a one-off grant of \$500,000. Quoting Whangamata Swimming Pool Inc chairman Rob Boston, it said a council report saying the board preferred Option 1, had been retracted. TCDC spokeswoman Laurna White said the community board had not in fact discussed changing Option 1 to Option 2.

"The board resolved to make the submission as per the report, the submission was prepared as per the resolution and submitted," she said.

"The submission has not been retracted and stands with the board supporting Option 1."

Whangamata Community Board chairman Ken Coulam said he would make an oral submission on the pool at hearings for submitters in Thames and Whitianga this week. The submission would explain most board members had favoured Option 1, but that there had also been support for Option 2.

# Free money for older people?

Joe asked me recently whether it was a good idea for him to access some free money by way of a lifetime loan or reverse mortgage. Yes there is a benefit, the money is free, but the catch is it will cost when it is paid back. Heartland Bank will provide money to older clients and no interest is payable until the property is sold or the person dies. This can be useful for a person who needs to do up a house to make it warmer. make other improvements such as kitchen or bathroom improvements or even to buy a new car. Of course the interest rate is higher than a trading bank would charge, and currently you would likely pay 5.95% interest. The rate is higher for a reverse mortgage because the bank has to wait what could be a long time to get its money back. The

debt can escalate quickly because interest charged is compounded monthly (you end up paying interest on the interest) Joe is 75 years old and has a property in Whangamata worth \$750,000. He wants to borrow \$100,000 but at current Heartland rates he would owe \$181,037 by the time he is 85. At 95 he would owe \$327,743. This might not be too bad if the house goes up in value. Usually a lifetime loan suits a person who is asset rich but cash poor. It also suits someone who has no dependants to leave the house to. Each person's circumstances need to be taken into account and other options should be explored before agreeing to a lifetime loan.

# 37 years of caring...

Diny Fokkes grew up in Holland, the oldest of six children in a catholic family. Her journey into registered nursing is a fantastic tale of travel and a life that led her with husband Gerrit to Whangamata.

Her parents had a farm and her mother ran a small store in rural Holland where Diny would bike the fifteen minutes to school.

As the winters were so very cold biking, with snow and ice she soon went to Boarding school for the next four years.

However, due to her mother's sudden death at 16, Diny had to return home to care for her siblings and run the dairy at the instruction of her Father, he was very old fashioned and Diny had no choice but to go along with his wishes.

However, the novelty of both tasks soon wore off and the family Dairy closed. Diny continued seeking a career away from the family home.

It wasn't long after her nursing training was completed and at 19, she attended an Agricultural Ball where she met her husband to be Gerrit. With her fathers passing from a stroke, Gerrit approached Diny "let's go to NZ?" but Diny wanted to work longer in Holland to get a bit of money together.

So now married, without children and earning good money they

finally came to Hamilton in 1975 where they sold their Peugeot car (bought over from Holland) and that enabled them to buy a section close to Waikato Hospital.

Building a solid Lockwood home and working as a theatre nurse after an orientation period to improve her English language. Keep in mind they didn't know anyone!

The first year was difficult in a public hospital, but she loved the work in theatre for four rewarding years before her first child was born.

Gerrits parents came over and bought a house in Whiritoa in the 80's and Whiritoa, was a very small community back then!

And the in-laws would return every year for a few months, the pair soon realised they wanted to come to Whangamata too, where the fishing was Gerrits passion.

Gerrit then saw an opportunity and leased a property and created the Whangamata restaurant 'The Captains Table' and after six years during boom times, he then started the Training Centre for hospitality, computer and outdoor life skills course, and it was hugely successful.

Returning to Community Nursing when her eldest child turned five years old. The district nurse in Whangamata, at that time was Margaret Littlejohn, who needed someone to fill in while she would return to home in England for 6 weeks annually and asked Diny to stand in.

Thames Health Board agreed to give Diny the position and then the casual job in Whangamata became full time with increasing travel to service Tairua and Pauanui . A very busy life indeed - living on top of Whangamata Bookshop

and nursing eight hours a day and then running the restaurant in the evening.

Being the full time community nurse to Whangamata, Tairua and Pauanui meant she had to reduce that to three days weekly.

Whangamata brought in another nurse to share the position. All is now run by Waikato District Health Board and Waihi based with only one clinic in Whangamata.

So after an incredible 37 years after the initial casual position, Diny ran palliative care, home based care and post surgical care to our community.

Diny recently retired 1 April 2021 just over a month ago and still on the Whangamata Hospice and Cancer Support Trust helping with equipment from bequests to deliver a bed, Lazy Boy chair or equipment for immediate delivery for the very ill.

Celebrating 50 years of marriage to Gerrit last December, plans now are spending time with her five grand children and visits to her daughters home in Auckland.

Diny says 'I have a feeling of Freedom - I can go to music, theatre and bridge and a favourite routine of swimming!'

# Campaign promotes tsunami alert options

An education campaign aimed at educating Thames Coromandel district residents about what to do in emergencies such as tsunamis, and explaining the alert options, will begin in July.

The "Tsunami Evacuation project" campaign will include signs on main beaches, targeted advertising campaigns and the strengthening of community response groups. The campaign follows public forums held last month in centres including Whangamata, and will run through to summer 2022.

The forums were designed to help people learn more about why the 27 tsunami warning sirens around the district are being disconnected from the pager activation system and to discuss alternative measures already in place to keep residents safe.

Community Board chairman Ken Coulam said the Whangamata forum had attracted around 30 people and a diversity of views on whether the sirens should be disconnected. Some had expressed concern about what would happen if cellphone networks were down, while others said they didn't even own a

cellphone and preferred the siren system.

"Some people thought disconnecting the sirens was premature," Coulam added.

The decision to disconnect the sirens goes back to last year when the National Emergency Management Agency told the council to either make the district's tsunami sirens compliant with national standards, or disconnect them. Replacing them with a compliant system would have cost an estimated \$5 million to \$11 million.

The council agreed with the National Emergency Management Agency that the paging system activating the tsunami alert signal would operate until September this year, when it will be progressively disconnected from the sirens. Fire sirens will not be affected. A statement on the TCDC website says warning sirens reach fewer than 43 per cent of the Coromandel's population and are not considered a reliable alerting tool because factors such as wind, location, and window double glazing can affect their audibility.

The council says existing alert systems will be more effective in the event of a tsunami threat. They include the National Emergency Mobile Alert (EMA), the Red Cross Hazards app and GeoNet app, both of which can be downloaded from Google Play Store or the Apple App Store, and the ongoing upgrade of the cellular and broadband fibre networks through the Rural Connectivity Group project and ultra-fast broadband rollout.

Other already-available alert methods include social media platforms, radio and television coverage and WHISPIR - a platform set up by the Waikato National Emergency Management Agency group. This system provides alerts to remote locations with limited cell coverage and will be rolled out later this year.

# Everyone Deserves a Great Leader: Day-to-day coaching

Once you've set clear and compelling goals with someone, you face the next step in the management process of keeping performance on track.

This can be broken into two conversations; praising team members for demonstrating the desired behaviours; and redirecting them when you become aware of any behaviours that are going to slow or detract them from achieving the goals or performing the task.

Whilst telling people they've done a good job seems pretty straightforward, doing it well takes practice and effort, otherwise it can come across as hollow and meaningless or worse, not get done at all! The three key components of effective praising; do it immediately and don't save it up to the end of the day or week; be specific about the behaviour that was displayed; and lastly, it is useful to encourage the individual to reflect on their own behaviour.

Redirecting an individual on the other hand is something that many leaders find uncomfortable. The purpose of a redirecting conversation is not "telling off", or "growling", nor is it to make an example of the person, make

them feel bad, or make you as a leader feel better. It is to get the behaviour back on track. Here are a few tips to help it go smoothly and have the desired outcome. As with praising, it is important when redirecting to be immediate and specific about the behaviour; to be honest and call it like as you see it; and lastly, you need to express

confidence in the person's ability to do the job well.

# Local fundraises for endangered elephants



Hi, I'm Emma Scott, a yoga teacher.

I usually spend time each year volunteering in Thailand working at Elephant Nature Park.

In the past three years I have raised over 20 thousand NZ dollars by teaching a donation-based Yin Yoga class called Ganesh Refresh in Taupo and online.

Now that I'm permanently in Whangamata, local yoga studio NOURISH have generously given me the use of their studio on Mondays at 10.15am so I can continue my project here.

I get to do the best job as not only do I get to support Elephant Nature Park but I also get to share the benefits of Yin Yoga.

Yin Yoga is a slow-paced practice using long held specific poses to exert positive stress on subtle tissues (ligament, tendons and fascia). This intern initiates the body's repair response, leading to stronger, healthier, and more supple tissue and a calmer central nervous system. It is suitable for all bodies and abilities.

My awareness of the plight of the Asian elephant started after a visit to a sanctuary in Thailand.

I really wanted support an ethically-based tourism company, but it turned out to be such an awful place that was not about helping elephants but making money. The elephants were so sad and broken and were not being respected or living in an environment that was natural or nurturing.

I researched and found out about the brutal techniques used to capture and break the highly endangered Asian Elephant.

I discovered the award-winning work of Thai National Saengduean 'Lek' Chailert and her Elephant Nature Park and Save the Elephant Foundation.

Lek is the recipient of several international conservation awards. One of six woman to receive the Woman Heroes of Global Conservation from the then secretary of State, Hillary Clinton, Time Magazine's Hero of Asia, the Ford Foundation's Hero of the Planet Award. They have won awards for responsible animal welfare within the World travel industry.

The park and foundation are funded through donations and volunteer visits, so times are very tough for them especially now.

I just want to continue with all my efforts and support the plight of the mighty.
