Three Waters Reforms: More than 80,000 public submissions received

The Government's Three Waters reforms are going through the select committee process and Parliament has received over 80,000 public submissions.

This is an overwhelming response and indicates the concern communities have with Labour's plan to shift locally owned water assets to four large entities.

When I speak to people around the electorate, it's almost inevitable that they want to talk about Three Waters. They don't understand the governance structure, they don't like how this process has been handled, and they don't want to see assets which ratepayers have invested in for decades centralised into large entities.

All in all, they don't want the management of water to

become another bureaucratic mess.

National have fought these changes at every step because we have serious concerns about the accountability of the proposed water entities.

Unfortunately, it doesn't seem like Labour are treating this process as anything more than a rubber-stamp exercise. They have limited opportunities for people to present their submission in person, which indicates they want to push through these reforms as soon as possible.

National is committed to repealing the changes and ensuring water assets remain in local ownership.

NZ Waka Ama Sprint takes on the Va'a world

The 19th International Va'a Federation (IVF) Va'a World Sprint Championships were held on 8 to 16 August in the United Kingdom on Lake Dorney - hosting the spectacular Va'a event for the first time.

Over the course, 1500 paddlers from 19 countries battled it out on the water. The IVF Va'a World Sprint Championships is the pinnacle Va'a sprint competition and brings together two events: Elite World Championships and Club World Championships - with a strong New Zealand presence in both competitions.

Whangamatā local Narada Bury, a member of the Elite Men's team has won gold in the V12 500m and silver in the V6 1500m event.

An incredible achievement as the New Zealand contingent was one of the largest in the competition with 300 paddlers and set a solid position to succeed on the world stage and bring back the gold.

The event was formally opened on 9 August with an athlete parade and festivities. The first of the official race events saw the best of the best from each country take part in the elite competition, with each country permitted one team per category (junior men, junior women, open men, and open women) over two days of fantastic racing. Zealand paddlers fought to retain their titles from the 2018 event which saw them taking home four golds and six silver medals in the elite team racing events.

Without taking a breath, the club racing took place over the remaining five days with paddlers from throughout New Zealand representing 17 clubs from Pawarenga to Christchurch to bring home the club medals on offer.

Waka Ama New Zealand Chief Executive Lara Collins said "the level of racing is like no other Va'a event

in the world, not only are the best of the best from each county racing but the club event encompasses all age groups which reflects the inclusive and whānau nature of our sport."

"All of the gruelling winter training came to fruition in the United Kingdom, and I was very excited to see all paddlers, club, elite and para, showcase why Aotearoa is a force to be reckoned with in the Va'a world. We haven't seen a World Sprints event take place in four years, so we were very excited to see our paddlers race!"

One of a kind leads to Proud Kook

Whangamatā News has found yet another great young achiever – Hunter Cooney. At 17 years old, he is the creator of his own brand in hand screen-printed surf wear – Proud Kook.

Hunter set up a screen-printing workshop and studio in his parents garage. "I promoted my launch on 20 August through social media and then a website set up to manage all my sales from there, www.proudkook.com" he says.

Hunter tells us his vision: "I always wanted my own clothing brand, and I wasn't really enjoying school. I was wasting time and not learning much, so I left to see if I could put my creative twist into this world, try to get the message across and selling through my website to take control of my stock myself."

He self-taught the art "through the internet and hours and hours on YouTube watching screen-print videos on repeat for months."

"My t-shirts and sweatshirts arrive blank and then I screen-print them all by hand, keeping it simple with only two designs to start with, keeping it quite exclusive and then when I expand with each release to start another collection with more new designs."

Hunter's t-shirts are \$60 and hoodies and sweats are \$110, he wants to keep his emotional connection and value as his own in-house brand.



He wants to be open-minded with his business. Proud Kook came about when he wanted a design on his surfboard and now its "pretty out of the gate, and next thing you know I launched a clothing brand out of it."

His siblings assist with modelling and he receives financial support from his parents – which he says "I'm really grateful for". Even his granddad did the voice over for his video release on Instagram and his gran helped sew in some labels, "it's a family affair".

Formerly the Captain of the Surf

Academy for two years at the Whangamata Area School, he didn't really enjoy the "box he found himself in."

His message to others is "just be open to trying new things and not feeling you have to go down the path of the traditional route of University or a trade. Have a passion, and if you think you can make it work, pursue it, put the time in and enjoy it," says Cooney.

He enjoys his own time management and setting goals for sale and stock control.



Opoutere students plant out Jo's Farm

On 15 August, 20 year 7 and 8 students of Opoutere School, along with the Principal Jethro Dyer, teacher Matt Sheales, Trees for Survival Facilitator Jayne Nightingale and land owner Jo Adams, planted 550 native plants on an area on Jo's farm that he had fenced off beside a waterway. A mix of cabbage trees, flax, karamu, mānuka and wetland grasses were planted.

Lunch was provided not only to the planters but Jo provided enough sausages and bread for the whole school with the BBQ manned by the Opoutere Fire Brigade.

Opoutere School belongs to the Trees for Survival programme, in which they are provided with a shade house and support of a facilitator. The facilitator collects local seeds at the beginning of the year, which are sent to Nga Rakau Nursery for propagation.

In September, the young seedlings are sent out to the schools involved in the programme where the facilitator shows the children how to pot them up and they are placed in the shade house with an automatic watering system until the following autumn/winter. A local land owner can then apply to have the trees planted on their site, which must



meet Trees for Survival criteria.

Trees for Survival is a charitable trust which works with over 150 schools and local communities across Aotearoa to grow and plant native trees along waterways and environmentally at risk sites. Trees for Survival's environmental education programme provides a hands on opportunity for schoolchildren to make a practical difference to their environment as well as learn about conservation, revegetation, wetland restoration and protecting stream water quality and creating habitat for our native wildlife.



New Resource Recovery van a boost

The trustees of the Whangamata resource recovery trust are proud to now have the Nissan van they need in order to keep the current community recycling projects running and improving and add more services to the people of Whangamata.

The Compost2Go kitchen scraps system and the monthly mini ewaste drop spot at the whangamata sunday market are becoming increasingly popular services with locals who are looking to reduce the amount of stuff which would otherwise go to the landfill.

With the generous support of the Len Reynolds Trust in the form of a grant, the use of the recently purchased cargo van will also mean that growth in new recycling projects such as soft plastics can also be explored in collaboration with the resource recovery experts at the Seagull Centre in Thames and many other like minded organisations on the Coromandel.

These projects bring the WRRT a step closer towards achieving the overall strategy vision to provide a broad range of accessible waste minimisation initiatives to the community, to promote education and skills training opportunities for

our local people and establish a Whangamata Resource Recovery centre.

The reuse, repair and recycling of unwanted goods which would otherwise go to landfill is a critical step towards supporting a cleaner environment and developing a sustainable circular economy.

A collective effort with other local organisations, residents and the TCDC council on the trusts strategy is a high priority for the best community outcome.





Project to transform Surf Club

INITIAL GOAL
\$660,000

by 5 January, 2023
(of a possible \$2m+ needed)



About Project Transform

Project Transform is dedicated to the revitalisation of the Whangamata Surf Life Saving Club's aging clubrooms at Williamson Park.

This vitally important project is for the ultimate benefit of the Whangamatā community and the numerous holiday-makers and visitors our beachside town attracts.

We have a major facility issue and what follows will hopefully explain the dilemma the club is currently facing with our existing clubrooms.

CURRENT BUILDING ISSUES

Essentially our 55-year-old facility is worn out, structurally defective, does not meet the required seismic standards, and doesn't work well for its purpose.

This is not a surprise for a building that has been located in such a hostile weather environment for more than half a century. The building has largely

withstood the extreme conditions posed by a beachfront location, however, the basic foundations, excluding external and internal cladding, remain sound. This is a blessing, as our structural engineering and architectural team can design the new facility around the existing structural framework, saving the huge extra cost of a complete re-build.

The need to transform our facilities is now an urgent one, given the demands on the Club today. The need behind the Club's original mission statement - "To save lives by protecting the Whangamatā beachgoers through our people" - has changed considerably over the years and the services we are required to provide today are far-reaching compared to our original base 73 years ago.

Today, not only do we provide one of the New Zealand's leading lifesaving services, but our remit extends into regular first-aid assistance, after-hours

Search and Rescue (SAR) support, and surf and beach education and associated sporting activities for youngsters from as young as five years. Our facilities are in constant demand throughout the year by school groups, sports clubs and numerous training organisations, with activities ranging from first-aid courses through to hosting search and rescue operations.

FUTURE-PROOFING OUR FACILITIES

In embarking on this transformation of our clubrooms, we want to give the Whangamatā community, along with all those who see the town and beach as a second home, a facility to be proud of, that is aesthetically pleasing, but highly functional and robust in construction, that will stand the test of time with minimal maintenance and serve the community's needs for at least another half century.

Club Building History

1950s

In 1953, the club started to grow along with the surf lifesaving movement in New Zealand, and through the generosity of the Williamsons the Club relocated to its present location in the Park for a perpetual, "pepper-corn" annual rental.

New clubrooms were built that year and in 1957 extensions were added, including a carport to house an ex-army jeep that had been converted to use as a rescue vehicle. Before that, the surf reel was carried on the back of a club member's small truck and access to beach areas, via local metal roads, was difficult.

1960s

In September 1965, the entire building burnt down. A temporary, small container-like shed was erected, and a large tent placed in the front as a gathering-point for members.

The Club Captain at the time was

Derek Somerville, a dedicated and highly competent lifeguard who was solely responsible for many significant rescues in dangerous surf conditions. Derek was also a competent architect and a great fan of the designs being introduced by Lockwood Homes of Rotorua, including the external cladding of the interlocking timber, which provided an opaque, plastic sheet-type finish.

Led by club member Malcolm Lusby, an Auckland builder, an entire new clubrooms was constructed in less than two years. Malcolm not only donated all his own labour, but also that of his tradesmen, including all their accommodation and living expenses. As a result of the extensive volunteer labour, and the generosity of suppliers and the people of Whangamatā, the new clubrooms were completed for \$30,000 mortgage-free. The original building was 4,500 sq. ft, with the ground floor consisting of a gear-storage area, first-aid room and separate changing rooms, showers and toilets, more

or less in the same location as the updated ones we have today.

The upper floor was 1,100 sq. ft and included two rooms of 10 bunks, a kitchen and committee room. The mezzanine balcony housed the tower, also in the same location as it is today. In December 1967, Surf Life Saving New Zealand President Alby Veant and Whangamata SLSC President at the time George Webb officially opened the new facility.

2000s

Over the years, key additions have included the current gear shed with upstairs accommodation, and changes to the main clubhouse front decks. In 2017, the bunk-rooms above the gear shed were refurbished to meet both fire and seismic standards, the gear shed was extended, and the main ground floor amenities and first-aid rooms updated, while an annex was added to provide a very necessary room for meetings and junior surf programmes.

Whangamatā News caught up with a phone interview with Bryan Black, life Member of WSLSC and Project Lead to Project Transform.

Bryan tells us "My passion for the club goes back 62 years when I joined the club at 13 years old. Outside of my family, the club has been a passionate part of my life. I was involved in the build of this existing clubhouse and participated in the various alterations so I have a feeling of how the community see it, today this facility when we finish it can be a real asset to the community."

Bryan went on to tell us "All monies raised for the Surf Club goes back into the community whether it be rescue equipment or to the facility and it's a no-brainer with the elevation of Whangamatā standing as one of the top resorts in the country, why shouldn't it have an aesthetically attractive building."

The photos of the specs for design in this article is an initial start, keep in mind more enhancements are being made, with smoked 'wave' glass on decking and louvres above and so much more.

It's not hard to imagine a great entry, with a reception area and having static and moving digital displays of all the activities and services including weather conditions, sponsors, events all flowing through.

So really it is up to the community, Bryan tells us he has to find over \$660,000 before the 5th January, Lotteries Board will be approached, but these are early days.

Bryan added "The public that

donate and even if it's \$1 will be invited with club members to come and see the final plans before we push the button to proceed with the build.

We have to look at the track record of this club, it has a fabulous record of good, professional lifeguard services, there have been stand-out rescues and stand out first aid provisions.

The public at large, if they can afford to donate, I really think this is a worthwhile cause for them."

PROPOSED RENOVATION & DESIGN

The architectural intention is to ultimately give the Whangamatā community a finished building that is truly fitting given its central location on our beautiful beachfront, and one that all involved can

be very proud of and that will stand the test of time.

Because the required renovation is extensive and to ensure longevity, the club will also carry out a number of additional upgrades to improve operational efficiencies and provide a facility for a wide variety of occasions and needs.

Major structural reinforcement of most load-bearing areas to meet seismic compliance

Replacement of all external cladding on both the main building and the bunkhouse, all decking, the roof, the rear stairs of the bunkroom, and all beds and mattresses

Conversion of all lighting to more cost-effective LEDs.

Planting day held at the Hetherington Road reserve creates a native habitat

Whangamatā News met up with a crew of more than 40 dedicated planters at the Hetherington Road reserve last Saturday.

Community Board Chair Terry Walker tells us "The Community Board put in \$20,000. The process started about four years ago when they removed the mass mangroves from the harbour, deciding then let's clean this up. So, two years ago, I said to the Community Board - let's put money aside and get it started".

Harbour Care has got in and planted it with plants supplied by Waikato Regional Council and EPL, special weaving flaxes from Bernie Ross and support from TCDC.

While speaking with Susie Artz of Harbour Care, she says "it was a great turn-out of more than 40 and had 800 plants - of which 400

improving ringcraft to gain his first international win.



The Whangamata Boxing Club continues to make big strides, with Damian Matenga Enoka travelling to Auckland this weekend (27th
