

Police Report

Whangamata Police wish you a safe Happy Easter, and enjoyable school holidays. A gentle reminder the Liquor Ban is back in force over the Easter period in all public areas - save yourself the \$250 instant fine by sticking to the rules.

I'm sure you've noted more online scams occurring in the media recently, or maybe you know people who have been victims of this crime. The internet is an important source of information and means of social interaction for children, young people and adults alike, but it pays to keep in mind that it can also present dangers, including online fraud, scams, bullying and abuse.

Regarding social media, read through privacy options carefully and make sure you fully understand your rights, and what happens to your data. This goes for app updates as well. Set your profile to private, and only invite or accept friend requests from people you already know. Don't post your address, phone number, or other personal information online and only give personal information to trusted people or organisations. Remember that banks and legitimate businesses should never send you an email with a link to log in. Never reply to a scam message, even if you're curious. If you're unsure about any requests for details you receive, do some simple checks first. Navigate directly to the company's website instead of following an email link, call their office directly, or visit a local branch. For those of you who are tech people, use a safe search option and reset your computers to use Quad9

DNS to help prevent criminals getting your information. For more information, visit: www.quad9.org.

In regards to your devices, installing a security program on your computer to protect against threats and viruses is a good idea. Consider an ad-blocker to protect against malicious advertisements. Don't click on advertisements on unfamiliar or untrusted websites. Set strong passwords and multi-factor authentication. Be mindful of what software you download and what permissions you grant to applications. Regularly back up your data. Be cautious when using public Wi-Fi networks - avoid doing sensitive things while using them, such as online banking.

Know who your child is making contact with online. If they are not your child's actual friends, question their online friendship. Know which social networking sites your child is on and what information they are posting. Talk to your child about the dangers of posting personal information online. Do not allow your child to use the computer in private areas of your home. If you or your child become suspicious about a person online, stop contact immediately.

Finally on a different note, please wear a cycle helmet and stick to the road rules when you're getting around town on a bike.

The latest from Mayor Len

The rain has stopped - we are good now, right?

This was the rhetorical question that Waikato Regional Council's Resilience Team Leader posed at a briefing to Transport and Coromandel Cyclone Recovery Minister Michael Wood on his visit yesterday to our district about the amount of rainfall we've had in recent months and its physical impact on the Coromandel.

Minister Wood was here to listen to local community leaders about how we need to get through not just the coming months, but years. To this end, the first step is the Minister's office arranging the formation of a community advisory group, gathering people with mana and also knowing how to get things done. The Minister will be back in Thames in about a month for the next meeting with

In a separate session, people from the business community also met with Minister Wood and outlined how they've been affected, what they need, and what they can do to help build long-term resilience to extreme weather and climate change. Stronger roads, more imaginative options to replace transport by road when storms close them, and more robust digital connectivity in our

further flung communities, along with reminding visitors the Coromandel is open and accessible (albeit with some slightly longer travel times), were some of the needs expressed.

There is no Wellington template that will be imposed on the cyclone-hit regions the Minister shared. He's looking for a locally led response that the government can come alongside and support where needed.

He says the government won't hold back on resources to restore SH25A - it will be reopened, but realistically not by Christmas. Geotech work on the site of the collapse is proceeding and a decision on which of the three rebuild options to take would be made in May. NZTA/Waka Kotahi has given a timeframe of 9-12 months from now for the road to be reopened. In the interim, Minister Wood committed to more support for businesses to get through until the road is restored.

He also told us that legislation will be passed imminently that will allow him to approve significant work like the SH25A restoration without going through the normal RMA processes. This type of legislation was used after the Christchurch and Kaikoura

When toppled pines severed the power supply to Coromandel's Wentworth Valley during Cyclone Gabrielle last month, poles and lines needed to be quickly moved to restore customers' supply.

The line of pines on rural Wentworth Valley Rd near Whangamatā took out power poles and lines at the height of the cyclone, cutting supply to 20 customers.

Rather than resurrect the poles and restring lines in the same spot - it was deemed just too unsafe for crews to continue to work there because of subsidence and the threat of more trees coming down -Powerco and Downer field crews worked quickly to deviate the

The new 11kV route was actioned in days - rather than the usual weeks - benefiting customers and the local community.

LiDAR 3D modelling of the area was used to plot a potential new route for the line and the local landowner who's property the line would deviate over was consulted.

The landowner's reception to the idea of the lines going over



her land showed a "true sense of community", Powerco General Manager Electricity Karen Frew

"The owner lives off-grid so she doesn't benefit from network electricity, but she saw the benefit for her community. It ended up with one pole being on the roadside and then one on her property," Karen Frew says.

"It all happened really quick and basically felt like we had the diggers behind us as we were drawing up the plans and getting the land owner's approval."

Downer crews were prepping the new site as Powerco electricity design engineers were finalising

drawings and plans.

There's usually a process to go through, involving meetings, checks, balances and negotiations before poles and lines are moved - all of which takes time. There was no time for that this time round.

Customers had already been without power for several days and a solution had to be enacted promptly.

"We needed to get those customers restored as quickly as possible. In the area where the lines were originally, the land was very unstable. There wasn't an area where we could just reconnect the line. All the pines were at risk of coming down, so the decision was made to cross the stream and go down the other side of it," Karen Frew says.

"I'm really proud of our team and our crews who worked tirelessly in challenging conditions to get the power restored to our customers. And thank you to our customers, whose patience, understanding and encouragement helped sustain us as we worked as quickly and safely as we could to get the power back on."

There's still time to do your 2023 Census

There is still time to do your census, so you can make sure you count.

Stats NZ census collectors are out in communities until 3 May to support people who need help to complete their forms.

People in areas impacted by Cyclone Gabrielle and recent flooding have been given more time to complete the census, including through locally-led events and on-the-ground support to 1 June if needed.

Everyone is required to take part because the census is so important. The information gathered ensures better decisions are made on things like providing hospitals, schools, public transport and infrastructure like roads.

Census staff will be following up with people who have yet to complete their forms. When a census collector visits, they can provide help with filling in census forms or provide new and additional census forms if needed.

If you don't have a paper census form or an access code, call the helpline on 0800 CENSUS (0800 236 787) or go online at www. census.govt.nz. The helpline can answer questions about the

census, forms, and access codes.

While most people are doing their census online, Stats NZ is helping everyone complete the census in a way that works for them, through providing more paper forms, more census collectors, more work with communities, and more accessible formats and language support.

Information about face-to-face support to answer questions and for help to get census forms completed is available at census. govt.nz/census-support/.

A family member, friend, caregiver, support person, or trusted neighbour could also help complete census forms. Or people can call the helpline and ask for a census collector to visit.

People need to mail their paper forms to Stats NZ. They can call 0800 CENSUS (0800 236 787) if they need a census collector to pick them up.

There is information for people in a range of languages and other formats (New Zealand Sign Language, Braille, Easy Read, Large Print, and Audio) to ensure everyone has what they need to take part and be counted in the 2023 Census

Where do Whangamata rates monies get spent??

There are 5,235 dwellings in Whangamatā. If the average annual rate were \$4k that equates to nearly \$21 million, plus of course commercial buildings. How much of this has been returned to this community in services and infrastructure, and capital works on an annual basis?

Whangamatā requires serious attention to infrastructure and service, for years locals have felt the ratio of rates paid against return and value is skewed.

On many occasions locals have asked the Community Board and Councillors to provide this information but it has not been forthcoming to date. Mayor Len Salt spoke at this year's ratepayers AGM. When asked if this information should be available, he replied that he "could see no reason why not and would look into this information being more transparent."

Council needs to understand the frustration from residents and ratepayers, over the minimal levels of service and infrastructure received in our community. Where are our rate monies going? TCDC are calling upon residents and ratepayers to make a submission to the 2023/24 Annual Plan which

includes a proposed rate increase averaging 11.4%, an increase of

The submission asks for feedback to enable the council to make decisions for the next financial year.


It is one thing to ask for participation and feedback as part of a regulatory process, but it is another to do it with transparency, honesty, openness, and fairness.

After the effects of recent storms and inability of Whangamatā infrastructure to cope, Council should heed the rumblings. Already there is talk of withholding rates so they can stay and be spent in our

On the outside of the circle were our senior girls saying their own karakia of safety over the juniors. From this moment on we had formed the bond of whanau and aroha. This bond just grew stronger and stronger throughout the week.

WINNING COMBINATION: I would like to acknowledge the gift in my son Shannon Hughes and Tautahi Hansen as they built connections

amongst all our teams not only as coaches but also as mentors. They too were coached by me and they understand Waka Life, they lived and breathed it. I truly credit the success of this past week to these two amazing tane. I have always aspired to share Whanaungatanga (living together as whanau), Manaakitanga (looking after each other), Kaitiakitanga (taking care of your space, picking up after yourself) and Tikanga (Karakia before Kai, bums off tables, hats off for Karakia). 

Starving fish signalling potential ecosystem collapse

Strangely white, mushy fish are still being caught in the Hauraki Gulf and further afield. Environmental and recreational fishing bodies are concerned the authorities are not acting fast enough to help the starving fish. Affected species include snapper, kahawai and trevally.

An Official Information Act request was made in December 2022, Fisheries New Zealand responded in March. Analysis of samples supplied to Biosecurity New Zealand and the Animal Health Laboratory show the fish are safe for human consumption.

More alarmingly, results indicate the degenerative changes in the fish's muscles and tissue breakdown is attributed to chronic starvation.

"It's alarming that the evidence points to chronic malnutrition. Our snapper are literally starving. This is not okay. The Hauraki Gulf used to be one of the most productive marine environments. Years of dredging, bottom trawling and run off from the land has destroyed the populations of crabs, mussels and scallops which are primary food sources for a variety of fish, birds and mammals," says Tairua-based New Zealand Sport Fishing Council Vice President, Warren Maher.

The Animal Health Laboratory highlights a range of issues that could be affecting the fish, including



"ecosystem collapse and decreased food availability and changes in the seabed and feeding areas of adult snapper".

"We all need to be worried about the declining food sources in the marine environment. Snapper are a resilient species yet even they are now starving. At LegaSea, we talk about restoring our fish populations.

"How can fish numbers increase if there's not enough food for them to eat?" asks LegaSea Project Lead Sam Woolford.

"It is time for more precautionary decisions. We must start now. Fishing methods destroying the seafloor such as bottom trawling, Danish seining and scallop dredging must go. We need to protect the food sources for our fish, so life can return to more natural levels. And we have to start paying attention to the signals that our marine ecosystems are collapsing."

The confirmation of our 2022 NCEA results saw WAS achieve some of the best academic outcomes in its history. 
Grass roots sports sees success

PROJECT TRANSFORM - CRITICAL STATUS

Hello to all Persons & Organisations,

Firstly, I need to express the clubs sincere gratitude to all those who have generously contributed to our clubs planned refurbishment project "Transform". Regretfully, we have now been advised that the foundations and block work structure does not meet the pending seismic strengthening code and this remediation work places significant additional costs onto our proposed plans. Although such strengthening is not an immediate obligation, the club would be negligent, spending public funds on a building upgrade without addressing our future seismic obligations.

As informed previously the budgeted cost of the work is \$2.5Million. For the club to lodge funding applications and complete building plans, we must be assured we have the funds available to meet our obligations. For us to approach three very important potential stake holders, being, Trust Waikato, Lotteries Commission and Surf Life Saving New Zealand, (who have all indicated positive support, but not formal obligations), we must reach a "funds in hand" amount of \$650,000.00.

As at the 31st March the club has in its dedicated building account, \$295,000.00 of which \$100,000.00 came from club saved funds. We also hold time payment pledges of a further \$160,000.00 giving us a total of \$455,000.00, giving a shortfall of \$195,000.00.

It is therefore vital, that we reach this \$650,000.00 target before the close off for the next round of funding applications, at the start of June this year. Otherwise we will not be able to commence the refurbishment programme until 2025/2026 season.

I am sure you all know about the services we provide and the use made of our facilities, in the off season, and by schools and other service organisations.



Wild Wacky Golf is a fun Ambrose tournament with women dressing up and teeing off after a cocktail or




two. For many women golfers this is their first time playing on a golf course.


To be honest the Facebook posts
