

Junior golf in Whangamata is going ahead leaps and bounds, and has already resulted in a notable achievement for another of our emerging sports stars.

Hunter Ussher recently won the Waikato Secondary Schools Matchplay Championship, winning through a strokeplay qualifying round followed by three rounds of matchplay against the best young talent the Waikato has to offer.

Hunter's success will no doubt encourage more of our young locals to work hard at their game. The surge in interest is due in no small part to the lead provided by some of our golf mad local teachers, with golf now included in the college PE curriculum. More and more of our students, including many of those in the surfing academy, are learning just what fun and satisfaction the game can offer alongside their other recreational pursuits.

They are also fortunate to be encouraged by a progressive local club, the choice of excellent 9 or 18 hole courses to play at and outstanding coaching from Josh Alderton and visiting golf professional Andrew Noble. ## Hunter wins Waikato competition

Hunter Ussher, representing Whangamata Area School, has taken out the Waikato Secondary Schools Matchplay Championship.

This is a remarkable achievement for the talented young man, considering he has only been playing seriously for a couple of years, and at 15 (Year 11) he was up against the top Waikato golfers aged up to 18 with all the experience that brings. The result is Hunters' best yet, and comes after two years of hard work.

On game day, Hunter went in with no expectations, and was ranked fourth after the early play.

Some of his opponents were widely experienced, having time overseas or were just very good golfers, so he was happy with how the tournament was going and felt that he was sitting where he should be.

Up next was a Hamilton Boys player, who he beat on the fourth playoff hole. Then a higher ranked player, and he won that on the 18th hole.

Progressing nicely Ussher knew his biggest challenge was the next game – up against the top ranked female player who was widely experienced. He won this on the 13th hole, a round that was "by far the best golf I've ever played".

Hunter was starting to believe



he could now go all the way, one game to play. His final opponent was another Hamilton Boys player, and both had nervous starts.

Up by three after nine holes and feeling confident. Then he lost the next three in a row and all square. Game on!

Ussher won the 15th, halved the 16th and then on the 17th he birdied to win the competition. His opponent had a hole in one on the 18th previously so it was a relief to not have to play that hole.

In some ways, Hunter was a typical youth in Whangamatā - school, surfing, playing rugby and after

school golf, but with no clear passion driving him.

Then, at the start of the first lockdown, his parents bought a house backing onto the golf course and the rest, as they say, is history.

Inspired by the proximity, Hunter became addicted to the game, and couldn't get enough time on the course. "It's all I want to do, all day, every day" was a common thread throughout the chat Whangamatā News had with this engaging young man.

grounding and humbling experience', and that while he expects every round to be his best, he knows that it's just not possible.

So what do you do? Practise. Then practise more. Hunter will often take a bucket of balls to a fairway on his own, hit them, collect them and repeat. Sometimes four or five times. If the course isn't open he'll putt on the carpet at home, or

watch golf on television.

When Whangamatā News asked if he has any golfing heroes, he answered very pragmatically - he admires most of the top players for their different strong points. Rory for his driving, Cameron for putting and so on

Attitude counts for a lot in a game of millimetres at the club head,



and coaching plays a big role in the thought processes needed to succeed. Hitting the ball is no problem for top players, it's the mental side that separates the good players from the winners.

Hunter attributes a big part of this side of his game to recent coaching from Josh Alderton. Alderton has instilled insights into him to consider how you play the game as opposed to how you hit the ball. It's one thing to know how, but it's the where, the tactics that count when it comes to the crunch.

Whangamatā News asked Hunter where he would like to be in five years time. "I would hopefully like to be over in America, playing golf, going to college". He is keen to play as much golf as possible here over the next year or two, taking advantage of some great coaching and working part time in the pro shop, then "I'd definitely think about it, maybe in my last year of school if one of the big colleges were to make an offer".

Ussher understands the importance of doing well academically, and says his father reinforces this. "If I'm not doing well at school then he won't let me play golf".

Advice to young players keen to improve their game - "It takes time, learn how to play the sport. I can't imagine how many hours I've spent, it takes a lot of practise to get



good at this sport".

Hunter just loves and lives the game. It has given him confidence beyond his years in social settings, talking and relating well to adults.

After chatting with him for this interview, I have no doubt that Hunter Ussher is a name we should all remember, and expect to see him shine in the future.







## WHC reserved for Riparian Planting

You may have noticed all the digger and mulching activity occurring outside the Firth yard, on the Hetherington Road reserve recently.

Home to some outdoor equipment, this popular walking pathway is getting rid of its dunes of waste concrete, rubbish, pampas and other pesky plants.

The TCDC Community Board has allocated \$20,000, and will be supported by Waikato Regional Council, who are to supply the native plants from their nursery stock, in order to clean up this area.

"This strip of land, provides an important habitat for our estuary birds", chairman Kerry Gibb atones. "By cleaning up this area, and planting the area in native fauna, we have better means to be able to help control predator and pest animal numbers too."





Whangamata Harbour Care have an extensive trapping and baiting program, that runs around the whole of the Whangamatā harbour and it's upper estuary, with its objective of restoring bird numbers in and around the harbour.

As part of this community initiative, WHC have been elected to lead the planting of native trees and shrubs, provided by WRC. They will be calling forth it's members and all community members in the weeks to come, to



help give a hand.

Whangamatā News also sought comment from Councillor / Community Board Terry Walker:

Walker stated "The Community Board has long requested this piece of the Moana Anu Anu estuary be cleaned up following the planting along the eastern side of the footpath by TCDC.

The Community Board stepped up with \$20k to support WRC in cleaning up their side right along to within 50 M of the Causeway, which is controlled by the marina's society.

While the work may require additional funding support, it will enhance a piece of our estuary that falls under Waikato Regional Council jurisdiction and is funded from your rates."

The work done to date is looking great and our thanks also go out to the local contractors EPL, Whangamatā Harbour Care, TCDC and WRC staff.

## The 'Not Hop' still a great weekend










## Winter's coming – come and talk to us

If you've been to Whangamatā the last two months, you'll notice there's no German couple in a campervan with two preschoolers. There's no Aussie surfer and his girlfriend in a strange looking van. There are no two young French girls travelling and working on a year visa. Even our own don't seem to be travelling much.

Our campground, cafés, clubs, shops are quiet and winters are not far away. Yes, business has had, and continues to have, it tough but it's our elderly that have felt it the most. Unable to socialise like they used to and often separated from family and friends either here or overseas, many are very lonely. Often a visit from a carer is their only human contact all day.

Our busy medical centre does all it can and community hubs like the RSA keep an eye on many. But it's not enough and more and more are slipping through the cracks and being forced to move to better serviced towns and cities.

It's well established that the Coromandel has one of the oldest populations in New Zealand. It's not quite a big retirement peninsula yet, but it's getting there. With the boomer bubble growing there's only so much the government can do.

What's the solution? Private care. Ideally local private care. If you can find it. Diana Fay from local private care provider Beside The Seaside has seen the market grow enormously the last 7 years. "It's busy" says Diana, "and it would be even busier if we could find staff. And yes, it's expensive but these days social services like DHB and ACC contribute to the cost which makes it more affordable. My advice though is, if you can find a qualified carer, commit to them – because if you don't someone else will".

If you're visiting Mum or Dad this Easter, sit down with them for a good question and answer session. Chances are they're OK and travelling well after all it's been a great summer. But it's the next 6 months which is the hard part and there's only so many coffees you have

## Fire report

Our brigade has been kept busy with several calls to various types of incidents. One call was to a house fire where an electrical device had malfunctioned setting roofing material alight. Thankfully the residents were home to assist in limiting the size of fire before our arrival. Also our brigade were on station for training so a quick response allowed members to gain control promptly. Other calls included Alarm activations requiring no action and a serious medical event on the beach

Our weather patterns have seen rain events that caused flooding in buildings and winds which causes debris to build up in water points. Some regular maintenance on both residential and commercial properties reduces the risk of damage by clearing out gutters,

downpipes and gulley traps. Storm water grates on streets quickly become blocked as well so removing obstructions from these also helps.

Daylight savings has been put to bed for the winter prompting a reminder to check your smoke alarms and have chimneys cleaned as well as clearing objects away from fireplaces. Something also very important for the welfare of your property and the neighbourhood is to have a check on the closest hydrant to vour home. This will be marked by means of a yellow arrow on the street and a yellow lid. Have it cleared of dirt and vegetation to allow for quick establishment of water in fire situations.

## Coastguard report

March 2022 was a month of Varied weather with much reduced activity on the water. Whangamata Coastguard volunteers manned the radio for 60n hours, handling 534 calls. This is about half of the calls handled in February. The operators are grateful that most boats now use their call signs. This allows the vessel to be uniquely identified as many names are duplicated numerous times.

Rescue vessel G J Gardner Rescue was called out 5 times in March; once to take over a tow from Pauanui Rescue. three times for mechanical breakdowns and once for a flare sighting. One of the calls for rescue was for a yacht which suffered a mechanical failure at midnight. The five crew volunteers were able to return home at 3.00 AM having towed the stricken vessel to the Whangamata Wharf. A job well done.

Whangamata Coastguard still needs more volunteers both for the boat crew and radio operators. If you can spare some time to be part of a very rewarding emergency service contact Ken Worthington - phone 021 266 4383. Full training is provided free of charge.

#### **Green Policies**

Only a politician could see merit in subsidising growth in the electric vehicle fleet when the extra growth in electricity demand will be supplied by imported coal.

## Why am I standing for Council... again?

When I stood for Council in 2019, I was elected to Keep Council Accountable

I was concerned that TCDC cost ratepayers over \$200,000 to produce an unsuccessful consent application to allow private promoters to run events in Williamson Park in Whangamatā that restrict access to the public.

That is what I've done in my first term.


I was shocked at how much legislation covers local government, making it a lumbering beast. The Local Government Act is over 700 pages intertwined with over 200 other enactments.

After I was elected councillor, our CEO stated, "It came as a surprise to me that we had overspent our budget by \$6.3 million."

A senior staff member tried to explain it. I said it was not a satisfactory answer. And I kept asking questions. I sought independent accounting advice and presented Council with what went wrong and where to improve. As a result, two senior staff members resigned, including the staff member who had attempted to explain this travesty of good governance.

I then realised there was a legal requirement to include such information in the Pre Election Report for ratepayers to consider before voting. This had not been

I challenged the CEO on this. I was backed up by the CEO of Local Government NZ who said, "Mr Gotlieb is correct. The legal



obligation on the CEO has been breached and there needs to be an independent enquiry."

The Mayor brushed it off.

I made a complaint with the Auditor General's office. A limited response in their Annual Report stated that there was a failing in the pre-election report and it could have been done better (refer to the article from the Mercury Bay Informer 23 June 2020).

I raised my concern that Councillors were not given information about legal proceedings TCDC was involved in. The response? The information is privileged.

No, it's not.

We are an elected board that needs this information.

It was only after I presented the CEO with advice from NZ's leading expert in this field - stating we are entitled to this information - that the CEO relented.

But as time went on, the information was either presented with not enough time to read or we were told matters were resolved so we weren't entitled to our voice.

Many requests were denied.

I also objected to council agendas having so much of what is discussed not open to the public. I had some limited success in opening this up, but there has to be more transparency with Council

One of the problems is allowing public consultation on proposed council policy, e.g.. allowing more freedom camping in a reserve.

I have suggested (as some councils do) that a sign be installed showing what is proposed with a plan and photo or diagram so ratepayers can be properly informed.

I raised this at a recent council meeting as some projects were being delayed because ratepayers were unaware what was happening and there had not been proper consultation. This was warmly received by Councillors, the Mayor and the acting CEO who are now seeking to implement this.

These are some of the ways I've tried to protect and serve the community.

You can count on me as I have the skills and experience to step in and remind Council staff and Councillors what their duties are to the law and to our community.

This is why I am seeking one more term to help make TCDC an even more accountable, efficient, transparent and user-friendly Council.



## **Coastal communities** discuss sea level rise

Over the last two weeks an initial group of our coastal communities have had discussions on proposed options to manage the hazards from climate change and sea level rise.

Our Shoreline Management Plans project team shared specific plans that have been developed over the last three years for selected areas of coastline most at risk of coastal inundation.

Online meetings were held for Whangamatā (south), Pauanui, Tairua, Ohuka Brophy's Beach, Moanataiari, Te Puru and Tararū.

Recordings of all the meetings are available on our website at tcdc.govt.nz/smp

Coastal Panels - made up of community members, business representatives, Community Board members, and supported by our Council, Waikato Regional Council, Waka Kotahi NZTA, iwi representatives and others - have discussed and recommended coastal adaptation pathways for the 100-year period.

You can find these pathways on our website at tcdc.govt.nz/smp

In some communities, there are options to maintain or improve the existing defences. In others we have done a feasibility study on building new structures. Another



proposed strategy in some of our communities is to retreat from the area in the future.

The various pathways for different coastal communities are based on the predicted risks, as well as tolerance of the risk expressed to us by residents during previous public meetings and project feedback.

The online meetings of the last two weeks will be followed by in-person public meetings when COVID-19 conditions allow.







## Citizen science monitoring of local waterways a win-win

The Environmental Protection Agency has a new environmental DNA community science program which is being actively used by restoration and conservation groups, iwi and schools in Thames Coromandel.

When creatures move through the environment, they leave behind traces of DNA. By taking water samples, this DNA can be collected and sequenced to reveal all the fish, birds, insects, plants and animals present in the local ecosystem.

Community groups take water

samples from rivers lakes, estuaries. and wetlands using special kits that are simple and easy to use. The samples are sent to a lab for DNA sequencing and the species present are then identified.

This is a wonderful example of citizen science in action. The data collected not

only helps local groups

Trust has worked closely with local landowners and restoration groups to encourage eDNA stream monitoring. Ric has also been doing some great work with school students who have taken samples from local streams. One study in Thames has shown that some native fish are absent. This has led to a feasibility study with the regional council to see whether fish passages can be

## Mary Taylor, community stalwart, passes



Whangamatā would have missed out on a wonderful community advocate had Mary's parents not emigrated from England when Mary was 12 years old.

A shy child, she attended Avondale Intermediate and College and on leaving school, Mary worked at Ashley's ABC Stores serving on the haberdashery counter, later becoming manager of the department.

This suited Mary very well as she really loved sewing and made all her own clothes, including her own wedding dress and bridesmaids' dresses, and her daughter and daughter-in-law's

wedding dresses and bridesmaids' dresses. After marrying Ken, Mary had her own 'cut, make and trim' factory, sewing mostly children's and babies' clothes - intricate and dainty work.

Mary and Ken were living in Blockhouse Bay when a friend who'd recently visited Whangamatā told them of a great opportunity for Ken, a diesel mechanic, in the garage next to Mum's Corner Store.

They moved here at Christmas 1969 (708 residents) buying the Shell Station in 1971. Mary says it was working there that she found she loved interacting with the public and she developed confidence.

Recognising that there was little for the youth to do, Mary started up Discos in the RSA which were very popular.

She also started Girl Guides and Brownies in Whangamatā, becoming a Guide Leader then rising through all the ranks to become Division Commissioner.

In 1971, Mary joined the Country Women's Institute taking on such roles as President, Secretary, Treasurer, Drama Convener, Garden Circle Convener, Craft Circle Convener and Kitchen Convener.

In 1989, Community Boards were formed. Mary felt that she could do more to help the town she had fallen in love with and so she stood for election and was voted to the Whangamata Community Board, a relationship that continued for 21 years in total, including 6 years as Chair, until Mary retired in 2013.

Very early on, with the Environment Waikato representative, Mary called a public meeting to form a committee to address the Harbour issues - mangroves (it became the Whangamata Harbour Care Committee).

Mary saw the need for a larger Hall and led the fundraising (\$300,000); she planned the Playground on Beach Road; was very involved with the establishment of the Transfer Station, the main street upgrade and Barbara Ave extension. And recently, she and five other ladies coordinated and raised funds to re-establish the X-ray facility.

These are just a few of Mary's many and varied achievements. Talking with Mary, it became evident that she possessed the ability to see that something needs to be done, the practical skills to put the wheels in motion and the commitment to see the job finished. All the while, loyally supported by Ken.
