## **Avoid Infringements**

Hello all,

Nice to see some summer-like weather around and a few kids splashing around over the long weekend...

Speaking of moving into summer, just a friendly reminder about a reoccurring issue we see every year with passengers in boats being towed by vehicles. Regardless of the size of your boat, the speed you're travelling at, or the short distance you are travelling, it is a fineable offence and you can expect to get a ticket. As the driver of the vehicle you are liable for a \$150 infringement. It is especially disappointing to see young kids jumping around in a boat being towed when there are empty car seats in the vehicle; -it's all great fun until something goes horribly wrong. Please pass the word around to keep our people safe and their wallets inflated.

We have recently seen a slight increase of offenders helping themselves to items from insecure vehicles. It is an easy habit to leave your car unlocked, but as summer approaches and the number of people coming into beautiful Whangamata increases, I offer the following simple advice to keep your valuables safe.



Thieves tend to search vehicles for cash, bank cards, sunglasses, GPS, mobiles phones, laptops, wallets and purses, sports equipment, clothing and any other valuable property left in a vehicle, and they are usually opportunistic in how they go about it.

- Always lock your vehicle and take your keys with you when you leave.
- Do not leave valuables in your car, if you do have to leave valuables in your car make sure they are hidden and out of sight. Do not leave documents with personal information behind especially passports.
- Close all windows and sunroofs and park in well-lit areas when possible.
- Do not leave keys to your home, business or boat in your vehicle. It may be more than the gear in your car that goes missing...








## Purchasing predator traps with new funding



HarbourCare Whangamata is very excited to have been awarded \$5000 by Predator Free NZ to initiate its Backyard Trapping program in households in Whangamatā.

HarbourCare's vision is to maintain the harbour for the community into the future by managing sediment, mangroves and pests. We are working with regional and local councils plus DOC and local organizations like the golf course to manage these aspects.

Last month, our band of 14 pest controllers trapped 37 rats and 14 possums plus put out 374 toxic bait blocks around the harbour.

This helps to make our area safer for native species like dotterels, bitterns, banded rail and skinks. But we can do better than this by empowering local residents to trap and poison pests in their backyard. So we have decided to build on our trapping and poisoning expertise and deploy resources in local backyards.

We're delighted to have been awarded \$5000 by Predator Free NZ for the purchase of traps, bait stations, poison and marketing materials; to be spent over the next



12-18 months. Our plan is to make an initial purchase of traps, bait stations and poisons and test these out in our local community.

These have different criteria from our trap line equipment as they need to be very safe for pets and small children and need to be very

easy to set and reset, especially for some of our older residents. Another factor is that some people are happy to handle dead animals, whilst others prefer the anonymity of bait. Some dislike the use of toxins, even in locked bait stations, especially on their own property.



So we will test drive some of the available trap and bait stations amongst our community and determine which is most useful for Whangamatā. We'll produce fliers describing all the options and distribute them widely.

Each interested property owner will be able to choose one of our options in return for a small donation to HarbourCare and one of our experts will deliver the preferred option to the property and assist in its initial setup.

We will use the free website trap.nz facilities to register all these trap and bait stations, and trappers will be able to record their kills on the site. Then, anyone interested will be able to see the extent of our backyard trapping program and its success rates.

Our target for the next 12 months is 100 backyards. If you're interested in becoming one of them, contact our Backyard Trapping Coordinator Lyn Norris on O21 1515 607 and let's get started on those pesky rats and possums!



hovering above – and it wasn't

Forest & Bird is kicking off a series of actions to get the Government to end mining on Conservation Land and all coal mining, a most basic step to reduce carbon emissions and protect our future in a warming world.

Forest & Bird Chief Executive, Nicola Toki, led the group at the Coromandel Forest Park, where they unfurled a replica of the iconic banner from the 2010 March Against Mining.

In 2010, 40,000 people marched down Queen St, demanding that conservation land be protected from mining. A young MP, Jacinda Ardern, was among them.

Then, in 2017, as the new Prime Minister, Ardern promised through the Speech from the Throne that the Government would end new mining on conservation land.

This hasn't happened and in that time, numerous new mining activities have been approved across conservation land right across New Zealand.

This year, a private members bill has been drawn that would end new mining on conservation land, and all new coal mines anywhere. This is the Prime Minister's chance to fulfil her promise, and protect conservation land for our native species, and as incredible carbon storage assets.

Ms Toki, who helped hold the banner at the front of the original protest,

says "In 2010, 40,000 people marched down Queen Street, demanding that conservation land be protected from mining. Our Prime Minister, Jacinda Ardern, was among them, carrying a Labour Party placard that read 'Ours. Not Mines'

"That promise remains unfulfilled. But with the Green Party's Crown Minerals (Prohibition of Mining)
Amendment Bill on the table, Prime Minister Ardern and her cabinet colleagues - Ministers Woods, Parker, and Williams - have the opportunity to show they're serious about climate change and to deliver on this generation's 'nuclear-free moment'. If they are, they must support this bill."

Anti-mining group Coromandel Watchdog of Hauraki and local group Earthwatch Whangamatā welcomed the launch of the banner in the forest park where a new underground mine is proposed.

Watchdog Chair Catherine
Delahunty says "We are on the
front line of this national issue
and welcome the strong action
of Forest & Bird and Greenpeace
for all conservation land. If the
Government will not honour
their promises of protection, a
200-million-year-old species of the

Archey's frog and a forest right here will be at serious risk."

Since 2017, a total of 78 mining access arrangements on conservation land have been granted, with more exploration and prospecting permits covering over 150,000 ha of conservation land.

Approved mining activities on conservation land include exploratory drilling for tungsten near Glenorchy; gold exploration in





the Coromandel; and permits granted across Northland, Rotorua and the West Coast to a billionaire Aussie mining magnate.

Numerous new coal mines are proposed for conservation land, including the Te Kuha Mine, which Forest & Bird has been battling in court for years, a new resource consent application for a coal mine in indigenous forest near Reefton that would continue until 2050, and planned widespread mining on the biodiversity hotspot of the Denniston

Greenpeace Executive Director Russel Norman, who also attended the historic march against mining in 2010, said: "Given that we are in a climate and biodiversity crisis, coal mining shouldn't happen anywhere, but especially not on conservation land.

"No government should permit the digging up of the most polluting fossil fuel - coal - in the era of climate change. Fossil fuels need to stay in the ground. To mine for them on conservation land is a double insult to nature.

"Greenpeace calls on the Government to support MP Eugenie Sage's bill to stop mining on conservation land."

"Twelve years on from the March Against Mining, when New Zealand got behind this banner, it's time to see an end to mines on our shared conservation estate. Our mountains, forests, wetlands and rivers are for our biodiversity, our climate, and our future, not for mining," Toki says.

"Our organisations will campaign to protect conservation land from mining until we succeed. This action will be followed by similar events around the country."




