Good times & dancing unicorns at the Half Marathon



The G.J. Gardner Homes Whangamatā Half Marathon, 10km and 5km attracted another record number of entries, with close to 2000 runners and walkers enjoying a stunning day on

Twenty year old Casey Thorby (Taupo) set a smoking hot pace on the half marathon course, with a commanding lead on the field well before the Wentworth Valley turn point, and taking first place in a time of 1:08:27. Odette Jennings (Tuakau) was first placed female runner for the second year in a row, smashing 8 minutes off her 2024 time at 1:20:35.

"It's great to see the continued growth in the event overall," says organiser Luke Garea, "and it's especially exciting to see the huge increase in entries for the half marathon distance.

"It's a phenomenal course out to Wentworth Valley, and relatively flat. We want the G.J. Gardner Homes Whangamatā Half Marathon to have the reputation for being a great course for a PB".

In the half marathon walk Allan Janes (Auckland) placed first in 2:27:06 with Penny Purcell (Tauranga) winning the women's walk, and placing second overall in a time of 2:34:26.

Twelve seconds separated first and second place for the 10km run with James Reid (Auckland) holding on to his 1st place title from last

year with a time of 31:55 over Kaya Corporaal (Christchurch) at 32:07.

Garea is also quick to point out that not everyone is gunning for a place, or a personal best.

"Over 75% of entrants enter in twos or as a group, with 90% coming from outside of Whangamata," he shares. "For a lot of people, the event is just one part of a great weekend away in Whangamatā and we do our best to make it memorable for every participant, regardless of when they cross the finish line".

"We're blessed to have a stunning venue on the beach and tremendous support from our sponsors who really get behind the event, plus the community involvement to help marshal on the course.

"Town was pumping over the weekend. The best result would be that creating this special experience for people will translate to more entrants each year, who stay longer and more local businesses will benefit," says

Rural Health Roadshow

The Associate Minister of Health Matt Doocey and the Minister of Rural Communities Mark Patterson have recently been in our electorate as part of a nationwide Rural Health Roadshow which reached out to 12 communities across New Zealand.

This community outreach was all about hearing from people and getting more insight into the challenges and opportunities in our health system.

Our region's session was held last week in Thames, and I joined the Associate Health Minister at the public meetings to listen to what people had to say. We also visited Thames Hospital to meet with frontline health workers to get a glimpse of the incredible work that

they do around the clock, every day of the year.

This roadshow is part of a drive to improve access to healthcare in rural communities, like the Coromandel Peninsula and Hauraki Plains. The Government believes Kiwis should be able to access healthcare regardless of where they live in New Zealand, which is why we have brought in initiatives like 24/7 digital health services, expanded afterhours and urgent care, and green-lit the Waikato Medical School.

There's always more work to do to improve our health system and I want to thank everyone who came along and shared their experience and thoughts on this subject.

They have now been bought out by EL GAS, where things have changed substantially, now it's going to take 10 - 15 days. I have two large 45 kg bottles and I asked them, when they deliver, to please shut off the new bottle allowing me to know when I require a new bottle, that way I always had another on stand-by.

The last delivery, they didn't, shut off one of the two, that I alternate. resulting in my having NO gas as



both ran out at the same time. It's now been 3 weeks since ringing, and still no delivery. I'm using a small bbq bottle on top, which my kind neighbour lifts for me to go on top of the main bottles.

Not only that, when you phone them, it's a 20 to 30 minute wait.

Now I face a \$4000 heat pump alternative.



Rua Gold, a Canadian-owned exploration company, has submitted an application to begin sample drilling in the area — a move that has sparked deep concern among residents, environmental groups, and conservation advocates across the Coromandel

The company's proposal outlines nine drill sites, three water pumping stations, and a helicopter landing pad across a 4,000-hectare section of land just north of the well-used and much-loved Wentworth Valley Waterfall Track. This development sits within one of three key catchments supplying drinking water to the local community. If approved, it would open the door to industrial-scale operations in an area currently known for its ecological integrity, recreational value, and contribution to the region's tourism economy.



Environmental groups warn that Wentworth may follow the same trajectory as the nearby Parakiwai Valley, where Oceana Gold — another Canadian mining corporation — is currently pushing a major underground mine through the Government's Fast Track Approvals process. That proposal includes a tunnel extending from Waihi to beneath Public Conservation Land in the Parakiwai Valley, threatening a natural hot spring, endangering the critically endangered Archey's frog, and raising significant concerns about land subsidence and forest dewatering.

"The situation unfolding in Parakiwai should serve as a stark warning," said Catherine Delahunty of Coromandel Watchdog. "If we fail to act now, we risk losing Wentworth Valley in much the same way — quietly, bureaucratically, and with minimal public input."

Private landowners near Puriri are also being approached by Rua Gold for access permissions, raising further alarms. Legal experts warn that consenting to such access could result in a permanent notation on property files, with long-term implications for land use and ownership rights.

Opponents of the plan argue that such projects directly undermine the Coromandel's identity and economy, which are firmly rooted in eco-tourism and the preservation of natural landscapes. "Do we want to be known for our beaches, forests, and waterfalls," asked one resident, "or for tunnel vents, helicopter noise, and blasting under conservation land?"

Earthwatch Whangamatā, a local environmental group, is calling for urgent community action.



"This is not just about one permit—it's about the future of the Coromandel," said a spokesperson. "What happens in Wentworth will set a precedent. Once these companies gain a foothold, it becomes significantly harder to push back"

Coromandel Watchdog was invited to comment on Oceana Gold's project and their submission saw contributions from international experts working pro bono, as well as dozens of local residents who provided powerful testimony to the social impact assessment. Many expressed frustration at being locked out of decision-making processes under the current legislative framework.

Earthwatch Whangamatā urges residents to stay informed and engaged. "This is a defining moment for our community," they said. "The time to speak up — and act — is now."

Poor TCDC Slipper Island signage causing confusion

Signs posted by TCDC as to public access at Slipper Island are misleading and are short-changing the public as to their rights of access.

The headline of the sign reads: "Slipper Island is private property with a small public reserve at Home Bay."


Maritime and America's Cup lawyer, Dr Hamish Ross has taken issue with TCDC claiming these signs give a false and misleading impression of limiting public access rights. The island is not private property, but a mix of both public and private property says Dr Ross.

"The public are entitled, as of right, to access all beaches and foreshores up to Mean High Water Springs on the Island. This is broadly speaking, the highest tides (except for storm events) and is typically shown by the highest line of tidal debris. Additionally, the public are entitled to access foreshore reserves of which there are several on the island, but which are unhelpfully, not signposted."

TCDC have claimed the signage resulted from a meeting of landowners and TCDC staff, but according to Dr Ross, no consideration seems to have been given to lawful rights of public of access to the foreshore and reserves.

"The signs are sloppy work on the part of TCDC with the potential to create avoidable conflict" claims Dr Ross.

"People should not be deterred by these signs from visiting any part of the beaches of this popular island,



but they do need to be aware of the boundaries of their right of access, be good guardians and leave only their footprints. It would be helpful to the public if TCDC corrected their signs and marked the reserves on the Island to inform the public where they can go beyond foreshore without inadvertently venturing on private land", said Dr Ross.

Our turn to provide for the sea

As global fish stocks continue to



decline and marine ecosystems face mounting pressure, one New Zealand organisation is making waves in the fight for sustainable seas. Founded by the New Zealand Sport Fishing Council, LegaSea, is a non-profit dedicated to restoring and protecting marine environment.

Founded in 2012 by a coalition of concerned fishers, LegaSea has grown into a leading voice advocating for responsible fisheries management. The organisation champions initiatives that prioritise:

- An abundant and healthy marine environment - rebuild our inshore fish populations to restore ecological biodiversity.
- Feeding Kiwis first over exports.
 This can be achieved through low impact commercial fishing and non-commercial fishing.

3. Maintaining access. Natural resources like fish are publicly owned so we want to ensure that Kiwis maintain free access to our fisheries.

"New Zealanders have a deep connection to the ocean – whether through fishing, recreation, or culture," says LegaSea Programme Lead, Sam Woolford.

A Science-Backed, Community-Driven Approach

Grounded in science and guided by Māori values such as kaitiakitanga — guardianship of the natural world. The organisation partners with scientists, iwi leaders, and coastal communities to advocate for evidence-based reforms in fisheries policy

One of the key concerns is the current Quota Management System (QMS) prioritises profit over the health of our inshore fisheries and the needs of the community.

Our current system isn't working; however we have an alternative solution, Rescue Fish. This initiative is about giving power back to the people and restoring abundance to our coastal waters.

Wins for the Ocean

LegaSea has already achieved several milestones. Their efforts contributed to the government's recent review of bottom trawling practices, and their education campaigns have reached thousands of schoolchildren and recreational fishers across Aotearoa.

In March 2023, the group supported a successful community-led rāhui (temporary fishing ban) in Coromandel, and promoted the Coromandel Scallop Restoration Programme, which aims to improve the marine environment and scallop recovery through community initiatives.

A Call to Action

As climate change, ocean acidification and human activity continue to stress ocean ecosystems, we need action now in order to ensure fish for our kids and grandkids.

The newly formed 'Crafty Fishing Club', run out of Craft Haus here in Whangamatā we are doing our part to support LegaSea and our Oceans by raising awareness and much needed funds. At the recent NZ Sports Fishing Council AGM in Kaikoura the Crafty Fishing Club handed over a cheque for \$1000, money raised by selling local fruit and merchandise. We were represented by NZSFC Delegates Barney O'Neill, Kevin Lynch and Mark James, who presented the cheque to Sam Woolford.

We believe in the motto; 'The sea has always provided for us. It's our turn to provide for the sea.'



Rescue Helicopter Trust flies into new territory

In a bold move to increase its funding base, the Coromandel **Rescue Helicopter Trust has** launched a major new initiative and is now seeking community backing.

In conjunction with New Zealand Rescue, the Trust has ventured into a lottery as it looks to grow the resources to support delivering rescue helicopter services.

Trust chairman, Whitianga's John Stephenson, describes the decision to partner with NZ Rescue as a bold shift in a move to secure funding for the trust.

The two-tier lottery is being marketed nationally and provides a range of first-class prizes including a New Age Road Owl Caravan paired with a Land Rover Defender, and the opportunity to own a JB Motorhome 7.8 Queen.

John said under the two-tier approach two lotteries were running with only 6000 tickets available for the JB Motorhome, and 10,000 tickets for the New Age Road Owl Caravan and Land Rover Defender option. He said tickets sell from \$100.00.

"All ticket sales go towards supporting the Coromandel Rescue Helicopter Trust which ensures that the life-saving emergency services remain available to people both living and visiting our wider region.

"Our trustees were excited when presented with this option and we appreciate being able to partner with NZ Rescue," said John. "We receive wonderful support from



many organisations, individuals and groups through fund-raising events, donations and grants - all being highly appreciated.

"Our latest venture enables people to support the trust and the work it undertakes with the chance of winning superb prizes.

John said when considering the prize packages, the trustees felt something that aligned with our region in being such an attractive holiday destination was appropriate.

While the trust does not operate its own helicopters it does have a hanger and base at the Whitianga Airfield. Helicopters service the region from Auckland, Waikato and the Bay of Plenty.

"At the summer peak we can have over 400,000 people around our region and at this time the requirement of rescue helicopter service can quadruple," said John.

"We are a region very reliant on our rescue helicopters; we encourage people to support the lottery so we can continue to return the support when it is most needed."
