# Credible, enduring 'Alliance' key

An alliance of Coromandel Peninsula residents and ratepayers met with TCDC Mayor Len Salt, councillors and senior staff in Council Chambers on 21 March. 13 of the 16 Coromandel Peninsula resident and ratepayer associations were present.

#### Who are the Coromandel Residents and Ratepayers Alliance and why do we exist?

A peninsula-wide forum, "an alliance" of 16 Coromandel Residents and Ratepayer Associations who have agreed:

- 1. Form a credible and enduring alliance of Coromandel Peninsula resident and ratepayer groups (the Alliance)
- 2. Advocate to Council for strong ground up democracy, through fiscal and operational empowerment to community

The Alliance will provide a cohesive voice which represents the broader views of Coromandel Peninsula residents and ratepayers, one that intends to work in a harmonious manner with TCDC for the benefit of our communities.

In the 2022 local body election we were promised change with meaningful consultation, transparency and accountability, and fairer equity with respect to rates allocation across the district.

But there has also been a

steady decline in the roles and responsibilities of community boards and this, combined with maior rates increases, has had a significant effect on our local communities satisfaction, or lack thereof, with council.

Many believe the council has lost sight of its core business. Alliance members generally believe the council's core business first and foremost is providing fit-for-purpose infrastructure, maintenance and servicing of assets already paid for by ratepayers.

There is widespread concern that the maintenance of ratepayer assets in the Coromandel are and continue to remain under-funded.

The cost of living is an ongoing concern. Housing shortages and the price of housing to buy or rent, medical and health facilities, transport issues and the everincreasing rate increases are serious

The Alliance proposes to actively and jointly participate in discussions with council ongoing on all of the above matters and means to be heard

How do we achieve the following, working in a harmonious relationship with council?

- Meaningful consultation
- Transparency
- Accountability

- Fairer equity to rates allocation across the district
- To be heard

Major change is needed. The status quo is not satisfactory; many residents and ratepayer associations are dissatisfied with how our communities are managed.

There is little support for a central Thames bureaucracy to manage and service infrastructure and amenities paid for by local ratepayers across the peninsula, or for faceless officials and staff decision-making.

There have been several meetings to discuss the roles and responsibilities of Community Boards and granting the Area Manager greater autonomy and discretion to work with Community Boards without having to go through centralised council head-office procedures.

#### **Proposals for change:**

- Increased responsibilities for Community Boards
- Regular reports to Community Boards containing full and up to date information
- Elevate ward Area Managers
- · Local budgeting and decisionmaking
- Prevent lengthy delays by use of approved local contractors
- Financial consideration regarding current rating inequity
- Improve council communication

#### and processes

There must be a change of policy. Residents and ratepayers' associations feel ignored, alienated and unrepresented. The current LTP process to date has confirmed those

The TCDC 2024/2034 "Tackling the future head on" WHAT'S YOUR TAKE, is set out in a 361-page document.

In the summary document 'Tackling the future head on', we are told there are five decisions to be made:

- 1. Managing rate spikes, three options offered.
- 2. Investing more in future planning, three options offered.
- 3. Investing in connected communities, three options
- 4. Increasing fees and charges to keep rates manageable, two options offered.
- 5. The future of our central office, Thames Council Building, four options offered.

Submissions close 8 April. Submit your feedback either online or by delivering your submission to the local Thames-Coromandel District Council (TCDC) office (Port Road) or tcdc.govt.nz/LTP-2024-2034

Submissions don't have to be complicated, a simple comment 'I/ we do not agree with this option/s.'









# Line dancing for our community

A group of our local Line

Colleen Rumney told us "Three of us have worked at Moana House over the years, and I still do, and we all are very much aware of the desperate need for this facility.

I have been affected by Dementia within my own family and have worked with those affected by it for the last 14 years and have seen the impact it has on, not only the person with Dementia but on family, friends and carers."

Whangamatā News heard from Garth Blake, acting General Manager for Moana House, at the recent Golf Charity Tournament who reiterated the importance of the new Dementia Unit to our community.

"We are a small Resthome and Hospital at Moana House, we have a huge need in the community for a dementia unit on the Eastern Coromandel, there is no dedicated facility here on this side of the Peninsula. An example of this was in January last year, we had a lovely couple in the retirement Village at Moana House who celebrated their 70th Wedding Anniversary,

6 weeks later, it got to the point when the husband couldn't look after his wife and the closest unit she could get to is Thames."

He is not mobile and unable to drive. His family is in Auckland, they have to drive down to collect him to visit her in Thames, return him to Whangamata and then return to Auckland. "Essentially he has had to say Goodbye to his wife, it's just not acceptable, we are pushing really hard to get funding to build a dementia unit, so we dont have to see this happen in families."

There are lots of things outside of our control, but one thing you can control is your help to provide a suitable environment for those in our community who develop Dementia.

We're asking our community,like you, to support our efforts to provide a safe, homely environment for people with Dementia that is close to their loved ones. Please help us with our fundraising efforts to build a purpose-built Dementia Unit in Whangamatā.

Come along to the Line Dancing Social on Sunday, 21 April, from 10.30am to 3.30pm at Whangamata RSA, and support the cause.

#### Food for Thought

For their own political purposes climate campaigners continue to accuse our agricultural industries of being our largest polluters in terms of carbon emissions, even dwarfing fossil fuel emissions. Natural science would suggest otherwise. Fossil fuel use emits CO2 and other pollutants into the atmosphere, adding new carbon that had been locked away for millions of years

Agricultural food production however, is quite different as it is part of the natural carbon cycle, drawing its carbon from the atmosphere. The foods we consume every day (vegetables, fruit, cereals, dairy products, meat, fish, eggs, etc) are all carbon based.

All of that carbon was extracted from the atmosphere in the form of CO2.

Photosynthesis is the natural process of plants capturing atmospheric carbon dioxide to produce the energy rich plant sugars and proteins that form all of the food products that sustain us and all animal life. Resulting methane emissions recycled back to the atmosphere are only a portion of the captured CO2.

It is not only trees that sequester carbon. We also are carbon based. We are 18.5 per cent carbon from embryo to grown adult. We retain carbon from the food we eat as we gain body mass.

We need to understand the importance of CO2 in the atmosphere and the part it plays in sustaining life on earth. Just as crucial as water in fact.

Raises the question: what would be worse, too much CO2 or not enough?

# A community project to be proud of

Construction works will commence on the Whangamata Surf Life Saving Club buildings on the 8th April with plans to be operational well before Christmas patrol obligations.

Following a competitive tender process over summer, highly regarded head-contractors Livingstone Building have been appointed to undertake the primary renovation and re-mediation of the club buildings. This includes critical aspects such as seismic strengthening; improvements to operational zones; and enhancement of several spaces, access ways and linkages.

Funds are in place to do this primary renovation and re-mediation work thanks to club fundraising and Surf Life Saving New Zealand and Lotteries grants, A big thank you to all of those generous supporters who have contributed to our project so far.

Dide Harrison, Club Manager of Whangamata Surf Lifesaving club told Whangamatā News

"We went to tender at the end of February with funds of approximately \$1.8million which includes \$100,000 from club savings, which has allowed us to enter into the fixed price contract



with Livingstone Building to do the primary renovation and extensions."

"We estimate a further \$300,000 is needed to complete stage two of the project, including replacing and upgrading toilets, kitchen and bar on the first floor, improved ventilation and heating, outdoor showers and ground stabilisation to the area in front of the gear shed extensively used for beach patrol vehicles."

During renovations the regional call out squad will use temporary facilities located behind the club.

"Its been a busy Easter weekend with members descending on the club to clean out and pack up the building. There are a lot of good memories for members in the old building, however everyone is looking forward to returning to the updated building that will be something the whole community can be proud of ".

The club is calling on all those members and friends of the club who have been considering a

donation to help us deliver the transformation needed to complete the project.


# Remembrance wall completion nears

This amazing project is an exciting event for both the Whangamata RSA members and our community. As a member of the executive RSA committee and additional fund raiser, I am humbled, delighted and excited to see the progress coming close to its big reveal next week. It represents the hard work and 'heart' of so many incredible supporters, local contractors, tradies, suppliers and generous donations from our Veterans, families and individuals, near and far. Grants assistance also helped gain essential momentum.

Geoff March, President of the Whangamata RSA agrees. "It came about as we were looking for something different to regenerate our RSA, we needed something to refocus our members, our committee and management teams. The original idea was to raise public funds to enable us to modernise our Remembrance Wall area, it was too small, and after 25 years needed to face the other direction, to cater for the number of people attending many ceremonies of great importance".

All of us have been amazed by the response that we have had, to enable an arboretum that transcends like no other in our township and gives our community a place to go to think about those who have sacrificed so much for us, to remember what we have.

Just last month, we put out a request for pōhutukawa trees for the



area, we wanted two similar in size, we found a couple, who generously purchased two from a tree farm for us and are now planted, giving forever shade, these will be admired for many years to come.

With the design from Ted Pickett, sculptor and landscaper, the wall stands in magnificence, it will have a

water feature, night lighting, seating and currently underway re-purposed brass letters (with precision work by the team at The MenzShed) It will hold four Service emblems also in brass, designed for remembrance, that can hold personal and family time, but ultimately it will be the focal point of our wreath laying as formal remembrance on ANZAC Day.



Geoff March told us "The Whangamata RSA would like to acknowledge the funding support and generous input from all our volunteers, we are humbled by where support has come from and what people have been willing to do, it gives us 'heart' that we are acknowledged and being an integral part of Whangamatā Community, both as a hospitality facility and a welfare facility for the many adjuncts, groups and services who use us on a regular basis. # Mammogram fundraiser possible for Whanga women

In November, 2023, Project Mammogram passed its first major milestone, \$100,000 in donations and currently that total sits at \$122,000. So, who could benefit from having a gold standard mammogram machine based permanently in Whitianga?

Project Mammogram committee chairman, Mike Brown of Whitianga Lions Club says achieving that first milestone is due to the support the communities in the Coromandel have given to this fundraiser. Both Whitianga Lions Club and Mercury Bay Lions Club members are spearheading the fundraising but many community organisations and individuals have also contributed.

The goal is to offer a public/private general mammogram service that will be more convenient for anyone wanting a screening mammogram. Biennial screening appointments will be able to be made at any time throughout the year, enabling people to plan their scan around their work or time it with a trip to Whitianga. The private service would also be available to visitors to our region who maybe tourists due for a scan or holidaymakers not wanting to miss their scheduled

"Looking at the map of the eastern seaboard of the Coromandel

Peninsula, we envisage the catchment area for people using this service as running from Port Charles and Coromandel all the way to Whangamatā, especially where private scans would otherwise be conducted in Hamilton or Auckland.

"We need a private/public system so that we can capture all age groups of women for mammograms in our area. The reason being is because women out of the publicly funded age of 45 and 69 cannot be breastscreened in the public system without a doctor's appointment and they're not catered for on the mobile service.

"Given the demographic of our region, it's important to provide a system that would allow women of all ages in our area to be able to be screened when they wanted to. "The gold standard internationally is for women aged between 40 and 74 to receive a regular biennial mammogram. Currently in New Zealand the public system provides free mammogram screening twoyearly for women aged 45-69. However, there are others outside that age group, including those with a family history of breast cancer, who may still have to pay for their mammogram but they will save the cost of travel to Hamilton if we have a unit in Whitianga.

"The public/private system allows for both those in public system and those outside of it to continue their screening after 69 or before 40 should they wish to do so. Breast cancer doesn't respect any age boundary so we recommend you continue to screen outside the publicly-funded age group.

"At our earliest discussions about this project, our goal was to provide a service for early detection and better outcomes for all women in our communities. That goal continues to resonate with everyone involved and your continued support for Project Mammogram is greatly appreciated."

On 15 February, 2024, Health Minister Hon Dr Shane Reti announced on Beehive.govt.nz that the coalition Government has made the first steps in delivering on its promise to extend free breast screening to women aged 70-74.

Minister Shane Reti says: "As part of the 100-day plan, the Government has now met with officials and discussed what is needed in order for the screening to be extended. "Breast cancer is the most common cancer amongst New Zealand women, and that's why the Government prioritised this crucial initiative in our 100-day plan.

"It's vitally important to all affected women and their families that we detect more breast cancer early. "Overall, our extension means women will be eligible for an average of two to three extra mammograms once the programme is fully implemented - and that means around 120,000 additional women will be eligible for screening every two years.

"While we want to move as swiftly as possible, we need to allow the health system to prepare for the roughly 60,000 additional women eligible each year." Dr Reti says there is a lot of preparation in terms of human and capital infrastructure as well as the expansion of existing screening services. Health New Zealand will need to also plan for the cancer treatment services required to support the additional women diagnosed with breast cancer each year. The existing screening programme has shown 34 per cent of participants are less likely to die from breast cancer.

"Catching more cancers early means better treatment outcomes, and we anticipate an additional 22 lives could be saved every year," says Dr Reti. "Raising the breast cancer screening age will benefit all women including Maori and Pacific peoples who have particularly high rates."

# Seasons for Growth

The Seasons for Growth Children and Young People's Programme is back in Term Two. A free 8-week programme for children and young people who have experienced loss, grief, or struggle with significant change.

Seasons for Growth is a proven, innovative, evidence-based, education programme for children and young people who have experienced loss, grief, or change.

Key staff at locally-based Eastern Coromandel Community Services Trust (ECCST) have been trained in the provision of this programme and they have been running it in the Whangamatā region for three years now. While usually hosted at our local schools, our next programme will be hosted at our offices at 505 Port Road in Whangamatā.

The programme provides a safe and supportive peer group learning environment, where children are able to build the knowledge and skills necessary to strengthen social and emotional wellbeing following significant loss by:

- Exploring the impact of change and loss.
- Learning about effective ways to respond and adapt.



- Learning that they are not alone in their experience.
- · Building on their communication, decision making and problem-
- Engaging with a curriculum that incorporates a wide range of ageappropriate activities.
- · Integrating their new learning into their relationships with family. friends and others.

ECCST chooses to deliver the Seasons for Growth programme because it is grounded in sound, person-centred educational principles to provide effective education intervention.

If you know a child aged 6-8 years who is experiencing loss, grief or significant change and you believe that they may benefit from this programme, you can contact our office to find out more. The

programme is 8-weeks in duration and runs in small supervised and supported groups. Each session is one hour, and afternoon tea is provided.

# Premiership kicks off in the wet Silcock Shield Round 1

Wet weather was the order of the day as Thames Valley Premier rugby kicked off for the 2024 season. All matches were played in less than ideal conditions, but the fields held up well, and close tussles across the board resulted. Paeroa v Waihi Athletic Centennial Park, Paeroa.

Referee: AJ Hartley An ill-disciplined Paeroa gifted their neighbours Waihi a win in this first round clash, with five penalties and a penalty try cancelling out two tries to their powerful blindside flanker Ionatana Talea Faaleaoga.

An early Waihi penalty was countered by the two Paeroa touchdowns, both unconverted.
