ARHT rescues report - May 2022

2 May: Thames Crew tasked to Thames to assist a male patient in his 70's suffering a medical complaint and in a moderate condition. Crew were stood down enroute and returned to base.

4 May: Kuaotunu Crew tasked to Kuaotunu to assist a male patient in his 20's involved in a paragliding accident, falling four to five metres. He was flown to Thames Hospital in a minor condition.

10 May: Coromandel Crew tasked by the Rescue Coordination Centre to Coromandel to assist with the search of an activated locator beacon in the vicinity of Turkey Island. After an uneventful search, crew were stood down and returned to base.

13 May: Thames Crew tasked to assist with the interhospital transfer of a female patient in her 80's suffering a fall. She was flown from Thames Hospital to Waikato Hospital in a serious condition.

22 May: Coromandel Crew tasked to Coromandel to assist a male

patient in his 30's suffering a medical complaint. He was flown to Waikato Hospital in a serious condition.

22 May: Whitianga Crew tasked to Whitianga to assist a female patient in her 60's suffering a medical complaint and in a moderate condition. Transportation to hospital by helicopter wasn't required and crew returned to base.

28 May: Manaia Crew tasked to Manaia to assist a male patient in his 50's involved in a motor vehicle accident. He was flown to Waikato Hospital in a serious condition.

29 May: Coromandel Crew tasked to Coromandel to assist a female patient in her 60's suffering a medical complaint. She was flown to Waikato Hospital in a moderate condition.

29 May: Whangamata Crew tasked to Whangamata to assist a boy suffering a medical complaint. He was flown to Waikato Hospital in a critical condition.

Just a car-guy from Whangamata

Whangamatā News had the honour of interviewing Noddy Watts MNZM, following the Order of Merit Investiture at Government House in Auckland on 30 May.

A long process that started with the Queen's Birthday honours last year when it was announced, differing and extremely honourable awards, given in a hierarchy, making Noddy a Member of New Zealand Order of

A confidential process, but he did have some awareness of it, because a lot of information needed to be gathered and researching supporting evidence, information from our Mayor, Beach Hop Sponsors, TCDC and so many more with the writing of endorsement

The process goes back nearly two years and on 6 April last year, Nodz received an email, which he initially thought was spam.

But then he realised it was from a government site, telling him he was nominated and that they wanted to accept him for New Zealand Order of Merit - which then must be approved by our Queen at that level.

Because of Covid, the investiture was postponed twice with various traffic light levels, so Queen's Birthday 2022 was the date he chose to go to Government House in Auckland, to time it with family members of five to attend - Andrea,

their daughters and his sister, who could be there on that day.

When asked if he found this a humbling experience, Watts said "absolutely, it was a real honour to accept the award and be proud of my achievements and represent our community. I was asked for my preferred name on the acceptance form so put my name down as Noddy rather than Graeme. Yes, this is serious stuff but I was delighted when Mr Noddy Watts was called to approach the Governor General."

Facing the Governor General, Dame Cindy Kiro, his citation was read aloud of his achievements, the medal received, a quick chat - then

the medal is pinned on.

"I'm just a car guy from Whangamata," Noddy said.

Noddy Watts has been a member of the Whangamata Beach Hop Committee from 2001 and President since 2016. The Beach Hop is a classic car, motorcycle and music festival that is attended by more than 100,000 people and brings an estimated \$8 million to the local economy each year, with several hundred thousand dollars having been donated to local emergency services and charities since 2001.

Mr Watts was Chairman of the establishment committee for the Whangamata Free Kindergarten and President of the Whangamata Amateur Athletics Club. He has organised scooter rides around the Coromandel for charity since 2016, raising \$15,000 for prostate cancer, Westpac Rescue Helicopter and Youthline.

Andrea smiled the whole time and was so very proud. "It was then, that I felt justified for being there" said

Noddy particularly wants to add "I just want to thank all of the people who made it possible for me to become a Member of the New Zealand Order of Merit last week at

Whangamatā News could not agree more, there's no one more deserving - it's an award for the whole community, led by a local legend.



Vaccinate flu and MMR

Whangamatā News saw the news on Influenza and toddlers recently, so we caught up with our local Practice Manager, Rebecca Townsend, at Whangamata Medical Centre.

Why are flu and MMR vaccinations so important this year?

Immunisation is the best way to protect our community from infection and serious illness. With the borders closed due to the COVID-19 pandemic, New Zealand has had few to no influenza infections for the past two years. This has likely led to lower-thannormal immunity against the virus in the New Zealand population and may contribute to a higher risk of serious disease.

As our borders reopen it's expected that there will be a resurgence of respiratory viruses, and seasonal viruses may not follow typical seasonal patterns. We can expect to have influenza circulating in our community this winter, but we cannot predict what this influenza season will be like, therefore preparation is of the utmost priority. Having both influenza and COVID-19 circulating in our communities presents further concerns due to the risk of co-infection, and an increased burden on our health system.

There is also concern that due to the pandemic, there has been a fall in our tamariki getting their MMR vaccinations. Low immunisation rates and reopening international borders increase the chances of a measles outbreak.

There is a national push to get more people vaccinated against measles, a serious and highly contagious disease that would put additional pressure on a health system already contending with the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. Vaccination with the MMR vaccine is the best way to protect against measles, mumps and rubella. While these infections may be mild in some people, they can cause serious complications in others.

Just one dose of MMR gives you a 95% chance of being protected against measles. The reason for a second dose is to make sure the 5% who need this second vaccine get immunity.

The influenza vaccine is funded for people who meet the influenza vaccination eligibility criteria set by PHARMAC and include:

- Pregnant women
- People aged 65 years and older
- Maori/Pacific peoples aged 55-64
- People aged six months to under 65 years with eligible conditions
- Tamariki aged four years or under who have been hospitalised for respiratory illness (including measles) or have a history of significant respiratory illness.

Please contact your GP practice if you are unsure of your immunisation status, have any questions about the vaccinations, or wish to make a booking.

Gallery's exhibit unique

Whangamatā News had the pleasure interviewing the three-dimensional artist John Wilson who currently has an exhibition at The Little Gallery, Port Road in Whangamatā.

In a world of digital trickery and special effects, it takes a true artist to conjure an illusion with a trusty paintbrush and canvas. All of John's three-dimensional artworks are originally painted by hand without any digital images or tracing.

He does this by painting a perspective in reverse: the parts on the canvas farthest from your eyes are the largest, and the parts closer to your eyes are smaller. As you stand away from the painting, the farthest parts seem to come forwards, and the nearest parts appear to move backwards, reversing the whole picture and creating a 3D effect.

John tells us that a threedimensional canvas has to be made a few days prior, and that a painting can take 10-14 days.

John has a particular piece called *Imagine* that he favours with stripy tents, and is in Whangamata presently "a feel of the *Lord of the Rings*-type landscape." Although at





this exhibition most of his work is surreal, every so often he feels like doing something different, and will do a flat canvas."

"Picasso once said that he spent his life trying to paint like a child. This inspired me to mix children's art with the carefully-planned paintings of an adult artist. I always look at things through rose-coloured glasses. I like to look for the good in things, and I try to depict this in my paintings" says John.

He left his home in Omokoroa for the UK last week, to catch up with family and friends after three years, so be sure to catch the exhibition running until 17 June 17 at The Little Gallery.

"I like to think that when people look at my paintings, it will cheer them up and put a smile on their face."

The Little Gallery is open Friday to Monday, 10am to 3pm, every week, and can open for private viewings.

I am the water, the water is me

Whangamatā News wanted to explore the Tamariki Festival plans in our small communities and caught up with Michelle Flowers. from Whangamata Kindergarten, to see what experiences they have had as part of the 2022 celebration.

Matariki takes place from late May to early July and this year has its first public holiday on Friday, 24 June, across New Zealand and marks the reappearance of the constellation.

Ko wai ko au, ko au ko wai. I am the water, the water is me.

As a kindergarten community we are committed to developing our kaupapa around the interdependence of the taiao. We understand the relationship between people and water, in which waterways - especially rivers are known as ancestors.

We have been researching and retelling pūrākau as we continue to explore our local curriculum. In Mātauranga Māori whakapapa always returns to Papatūānuku and Ranginui. Kaikao recently attended the Te Korowai's fabulous sessions on the creation story.

We have been lucky enough to share some beautiful time watching and feeding some Tuna (eels). pictured above, in the river with one of our kindergarten whānau. These adventures have started many conversations about eels as we have been exploring the pūrākau surrounding tuna. They are



very fascinating creatures and an important part of our taiao.

We have learnt that a longfin eel can live in our awa for 90 years or more. At the end of her life, she treks 2,500 kilometres north to breed. Haramai he āhua - what a journey! Her babies then swim all the way back.

The pūrākau of how Maui used his magic to kill the first great eel by digging a huge hole beside the river, then saying a karakia to make the rains come down and create a flood forcing the eel into the hole, lead to us creating our own mud pit at kindergarten in which the tamariki retell this story.

Maui was so angry with this great eel he cut off its head and threw it into the sea. Then he chopped off its tail and threw that into the river. Finally he threw the middle part of the eel far into the ngahere. We now have conger eels in the sea, the tuna in the rivers and the vines in the ngahere. They all came from that one great eel.

In November 2021, I booked an appointment with Whangamata Area School's Gateway Coordinator and Careers Specialist, Bev Scorringe. Mrs Scorringe analysed my course selection and asked me about my interests outside of school. I expressed that I enjoyed literature-rich subjects, creative outlets and writing essays. Mrs Scorringe utilized this information and composed a selection of modules for me to choose from.

Nearing the end of the first semester I discovered a fondness for journalism and the Bachelor of Communication Studies degree immediately caught my eye. Auckland University of Technology is well regarded nationally as graduating students are known to pick up the top jobs in New Zealand's most prestigious media outlets. Next year, I intend to pursue this qualification, majoring in Journalism.



It's exciting times for poker in the Thames Coromandel region.


You can catch us all at the Whangamata Club on Monday nights from 5.30pm.

The Whangamata Club is also hosting the Thames Coromandel Poker Championships for the first time ever in mid-September. Busy times ahead.




Theatre Society presents the infamous Mark Wright

I still remember that day, like it was yesterday

Whangamatā News had the pleasure of attending the Whangamata Area School Year 11 presentation and devised drama of the 1953 Tangiwai disaster, 69 years ago.

A group of 12 student actors portrayed New Zealand's worst rail disaster with incredible accuracy. No teacher assisted them - they wrote the entire script themselves and set the stage too.

The lights came down and with clever lighting dimming onto speaking parts, I was brought back to a time my father recalled. Each actor had a large amount of script to learn and deliver, not one mistake,

The costumes set in the time period, the steam across the stage, whistle blowing and the call of the train 925 to board together with the sound effects of the crash took it to another level

They even built into the script historic events in New Zealand at

the time of the tragedy, recalling our Queen's first visit to New Zealand, test match cricket and introducing the fact that the tracks were, indeed, in need of maintenance.

The flash flood, brought about by the collapse of Ruapehu's greater walls, caused the deaths of 151 passengers.

Impressively, all the actors portrayed differing and real roles of those onboard: the ticket master; a young woman off to Auckland to marry; a young girl and her teddy 'Freddy'; aunties heading home up north; a voung woman who got off at the train at Taihape - on the advice of another mother seated next to her who was also headed to Auckland to her 19-year-old's wedding; and an old man seeking first class. It was all there, describing the aftermath, the fear on the faces, the freezing cold water, the bodies recovered from the wreckage. They would never be the same, certainly not after that Christmas Eve...

When time stopped.

"These talented students proudly produced and created a moving fictional perspective of the Tangiwai disaster.

"Through this impressive production, the students earnt 9 NCEA credits. Five for devising and writing the play and four for using their acting techniques on stage. The WAS Kura is extremely impressed and proud of this diverse group of students' achievements

"As a teacher, this week has been a career highlight for me, seeing these students be the best they can be. Displaying such pride when sharing their had mahi and creative ideas with their whanau and community".

Agreed - I found the students had complex characters, great eye contact and overall a very impressive level of acting.

Annual ramp fees to rise 1 July

There'll be changes to boat ramp launching and boat trailer parking fees around our district, following decisions made by our Council at its draft Annual Plan deliberation earlier this week.

Council endorsed fees of:

- A combined annual fee for boat launching and trailer parking set
- A launching only annual fee of \$45
- A daily trailer parking fee of \$15 per day
- A daily launching fee of \$15 per day.
- These fees will apply at nine Council boat ramps from 1 July; the remaining 17 would remain free to use.



Trailer parking fees already exist at six of our boat ramps. The new parking fee would apply to three additional ramps and the new launching fee would apply at all nine ramps, listed here:

- Sugarloaf (Te Kouma)
- Whangapoua
- Matarangi
- Whitianga Wharf/The Esplanade
- Robinson Rd, Whitianga

- Purangi (Cooks Beach Purangi Reserve)
- Tairua Wharf
- Royal Billy Point, Pāuanui
- Beach Rd, Whangamatā

"Our coast is such an integral part of who we are as a district," says our Mayor Sandra Goudie. "Boat ramps and wharves are important assets to help people enjoy the water. But they're costly to maintain and replace or upgrade when needed. This change to the fees is about shifting some of that cost from ratepayers to the people who use the facilities. The fees collected will stay in the local area to help pay for the boat ramps and wharves."




