

Key facility has great support

In a community like ours, local business support is key to making things happen, whether it's events or ensuring facilities are available for residents.



Humphrey is ready for Christmas!

Last week, Jennie, Mark and Gavin from Enterprise Whangamata **Business Association gave** Humphrey a much needed makeover.

It's been a harsh winter for his coat, his membrane suffered some mean conditions, but he is back ready to view and photograph in all his glory.

If you didn't know, here is some background to our favourite sea elephant. Thanks to everyone that gave us more than 150 likes and comments.

There was an element of excitement for us and our communities, at the end of July 2021, when a recycled fibreglass sculpture of Humphrey, the elephant seal found its way to a most appropriate resting place near the foreshore by the causeway Whangamatā.



This fibreglass sculpture was originally made just over three decades ago by a local Whangamatā surfboard maker, Anderson Surfboards. It took pride of place in the Annual Labour Weekend parades.

In 2021, Menzshed strengthened his insides and made him viable for public admiration. Many thanks to Whangamata Woodworks who gave him a new look.

When Humphrey first arrived at Whangamatā in the early 1980's. Humphrey then spent the next several years visiting this stretch of coastline - known as Coromandel's eastern seaboard - considered unusual for an elephant seal to be seen so far North from the Antarctic.

Humphrey (temporarily named Willie on first arrival at Tuhua or Mayor Island) came as a surprise to local residents from far and wide - Tairua, Pauanui, Opoutere, Whangamatā, Otahu, Bowentown, down to Katikati and even reported at Tauranga enjoying a spot of Mount Maunganui surf and sand. He became a much loved marine mammal by many.

Humphrey's choice of place and activity - sunbathing, sleeping on the sand, a favourite, along with a spot of surfing.

Enjoy, everyone! He is back, in style.

- 62 people home for Christmas! Last season our lifeguards patrolled for over 5500 hours, rescued 62 people, and assisted an additional 61 to safety, with 173 preventative actions taken which impacted 6,600 people. Of the 10 first aid incidents recorded, two were transported by ambulance to hospital. Our team also provided educational services to over 200 children through our Junior Surf programme.

WRA Survey 2023 update

The Whangamata Ratepayers Association (WRA) has presented the results of the WRA survey 2023 to both the Community Board, Thames Coromandel District Council (TCDC), Mayor Len Salt and councillors.

To view the presentation please visit the WRA website: www.whangamataratepayers.org.nz.

The mayor congratulated WRA on an excellent survey and stated that he would reach out to the WRA and set up an independent meeting and go through the survey results in more detail.

To date the WRA have received no communication from the Mayor or TCDC despite contacting the mayor's office and requesting the meeting as stated.

WRA are very concerned that once again, Whangamatā will receive very



little funding from the \$20million + of rates collected annually. TCDC 10-year long term plan (LTP) is being drafted and unfortunately some projects planned are not a priority highlighted in the survey.

The survey highlighted that no further new projects be undertaken by TCDC, in the Whangamatā area, until satisfactory repairs and maintenance of existing run-down council assets are completed.

On many occasions the WRA have asked the Council where and what the Whangamatā rates are spent on. To date they have not received a response. The survey highlighted that the ratepayers and residents of Whangamatā want more

transparency around where and what their rates are spent on.

WRA have presented to TCDC a concept that the local community would provide support to upgrade some of the run-down council assets i.e., Dune Care with planting, Harbour Care planting, weeding beach and estuary areas, etc. The Port Road seats and viewing platforms in Hunt Road were identified as being areas that required work, Gail as a member of

WRA worked with Menzshed and Council to produce the repair work plan.

Menzshed are currently repairing and upgrading council seats and benches in Hunt Road, and some 40 other benches in the town centre.

WRA is doing considerable work behind the scenes on behalf of the residents of Whangamatā and will continue to seek co-operation from the Mayor and TCDC.





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Self vaginal swabs – a real game changer

A new cervical self-screening test is available now at our Whangamata Medical Centre.

I recently was due for a smear test, and like all of us I was dreading it. Don't get me wrong, there are worse things for sure, but to my delight my lovely nurse told me, that all that's changed now! No more lie on your side, leave dignity at the door and collect it on the way out... it was simple, private, fast and much better than the Covid swab up your nose bizzo!

So simply wash your hands in the private bathroom, insert swab and wiggle all about up your vagina, put it into the tube of liquid, seal the cap, give it to your lovely nurse and there it is... done!

Even better, this test is expected to increase screening rates and significantly reduce cervical cancer deaths in Aotearoa New Zealand.

The self-swab will usually be done in privacy, at a health clinic, doctor's surgery or community clinic. Some health centres may offer a take-home option, but this won't be the norm until HPV testing becomes more established.

The HPV primary screening test is a simple and quick swab that people can choose to do themselves. It detects the presence of the human papillomavirus (HPV) which causes more than 95 percent of cervical cancers.

This year also marks the start of free cervical screening for people aged 30 and over who have never had a cervical screen or who haven't had a screen in the last five years. It also applies to Community Services Card holders and Māori and Pacific people.

Dr Nick Chamberlain, National Director, Te Whatu Ora National Public Health Service, says HPV primary screening will be a game changer.

"Not only is this test easier and less intrusive, it's also a better, more sensitive test that will prevent more cancers. It also means most people will only have



to be screened every five years instead of every three."

The new HPV test won't totally replace the cervical sample test (often called a smear test) which remains an option and will still be necessary to check if the HPV virus has caused cell abnormalities.

Cervical screening is for eligible women and people with a cervix aged 25 to 69. New Zealand's move to HPV primary screening follows the adoption of the new test in Australia, the United Kingdom, Ireland, and several other European countries.

The introduction of HPV primary screening is expected to help towards addressing longstanding inequities for Māori and Pacific people, who have higher rates of incidence and death from cervical cancer. Selah Hart, Maiaka Hāpori Deputy Chief Executive Public and Population Health, Te Aka Whai Ora - Māori Health Authority, says currently only around 60% of wāhine Māori access screening.

"We know cost has been an issue, as well as the invasive nature of the cervical sample test. The removal of these barriers will undoubtedly improve access for wāhine Māori who are currently under screened, and therefore more at risk of late diagnosis.

Personally, I urge all ladies in Whangamatā to make the booking with the nurse team... it's a real game changer.
