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## Free workshop to help rain anxiety

A free workshop is coming to Whangamatā to support people experiencing weather-related anxiety, following Cyclone Gabrielle and recent flooding.

While severe weather can have a devastating impact on property and infrastructure, it also has a significant and ongoing impact on people's mental health and wellbeing.

Blueprint for Learning's new workshop, Weathering the Storm, is designed to help. The 4-hour in-person workshop explores weather-related anxiety and the range of impacts extreme weather can have on individuals, whānau and communities.

The workshop helps those who have been personally impacted by extreme weather to build resilience, as well as give tools to people who are working in communities supporting others.

"We have seen an increase in severe weather events in Aotearoa and we know this is causing ongoing stress and anxiety for many people," says Lotta Dann, Project Lead for Weathering the Storm.



"Unfortunately, we can't stop it from raining but we can ensure people have the knowledge and tools to manage the stress and heightened emotions that rain and extreme weather can cause. They'll also get practical advice on how to support others, including children, and tips to reduce weather-related anxiety."

The in-person workshop is free to attend, thanks to funding from Te Whatu Ora, and includes lunch.



## TCDC LTP 2024-2034 and what's in it for us



#### Have Your Say: The Importance of Community Input on the Council's Long-Term Plan 2024-2034

The future of our communities lies in our hands, and now is the time to shape it. The Council's Long-Term Plan (LTP) for 2024-2034 is currently open for public consultation until April 8th, 2024. This document outlines how our rates will be utilized over the next decade, and your voice matters in this decision-making process.

One of the key priorities of this proposed LTP is enhancing the resilience of our roading infrastructure. The Council aims to submit proposals to both the government's GPS roading fund and the \$6 billion Roading Recovery Fund. While there is optimism surrounding these submissions, it's crucial to recognize that they a proposal, with funding yet to be confirmed.

Another significant aspect of the plan is the Shoreline Management program focusing on addressing coastal hazards. These first up Ambitious projects are the \$78

million sea wall in Thames and the \$4 million flood protection stock bank in Tairua. However, similar to the roading initiatives, funding for these coastal projects remains uncertain, relying solely on assumptions of \$60% Government funding and 40% shared funded through those who benefit and the others.

A notable concern highlighted in the consultation document is the apparent disproportionality in locally funded project spending across different district community boards. The allocation of funds raises questions about the criteria used to assess fairness and equity. Here's a breakdown of the projected expenditure for community facilities in each district ward:

- Thames: \$46.239 million
- Coromandel: \$8.559 million
- Mercury Bay: \$25.819 million
- Tairua/Pauanui: \$6.386 million - Whangamata: \$6.246 million

WRA's list of projects, submitted through the Community Board for inclusion in the 2024-2034 LTP

- Stormwater and flooding mitigation \$9,171 million IN
- Regular maintenance and servicing of infrastructure assets

paid for by ratepayers (OPEX)

- Whangamata Resource Recovery Centre (Seagull Centre): OUT
- Cycleway from town centre to Mountain Bike Park: OUT
- Roading, Footpath and Streetlight improvements: CUT \$295K and \$435K over 10 years
- Fire Station Playground upgrade.
- Whangamata Beach, Coastal erosion protection, keep the beach clean, repair the cross-dune accessways. \$52K over 10 years
- Whangamata Spatial Plan No definitive date for implementation
- · Widen The Causeway Bridge for both cyclist and pedestrian safety.
- · Additional and renovation of existing Public Conveniences. Williamson Park toilets \$1,039,000: Beach Road toilets (Boat ramp) \$336K: Ocean Sports Club \$108K

For the record Whangamata environs contribute approximately 23% of the Council rates income which equates to around \$20M.



## An incredible 173 meals last month





## Community pool set to close for painting

From 3pm on 3 April, the Whangamatā Real Estate Community Pool will close for a much-needed refurbishment of the pool interior, reopening early June.

The Whangamatā Community Pool is an asset for our Community. With many families making the most of the pool throughout the summer, and now through the winter too, it's a fabulous facility to have in town.

The pool maintenance, development and funding is run by a dedicated Committee of volunteers, who employ a Pool Manager and Lifeguards.

The pool's interior was last painted in 2017, and it's now time for

maintenance work to be done to ensure the facility is in top shape for the years to come.

An exhaustive research process has explored many options for the pool's interior surface. These included vinyl, tiles, a stone finish, and paint. The Committee has collaborated with consultants, specialist contractors and local experts to ensure an optimal long-term solution for the pool and community.

Over a 10-week period, the pool will be drained, the surface prepared, and the pool interior repainted.

When the pool reopens in early June, for our third winter, it will be



fresh and ready for our community.

This significant investment is enabled by grants from TCDC, our sponsors, and the volunteer hours invested by the Committee.

All concession cards will continue to be valid upon reopening, and all Season passes will be extended by the duration of the closure. The pool will be closed to all from 3pm on Wednesday, April 3rd, through to early June.

If you're not already, please join our mailing list by chatting to one of our friendly lifeguards. Regular updates on the project will be available via email, Facebook and at whangapool.co.nz.

Once the pool closes, and prior to it being drained, we will be running our once-in-a-decade 'Dogs in Togs' event between 3pm & 4.30pm on Wednesday, 3 April. Please see our Facebook page for more information.

## Coastguard return to full training

Already we have two months of the new year behind us. Our Coastguard Rescue Vessel crew have now returned to full training schedules including their annual "in water survivability test" which requires all crew to experience time in the water in full kit. 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

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

## Local groms making waves

Competing and performing under pressure isn't the first thing that comes to mind when you think about surfing but that's exactly what several of our local groms have been doing over the last month, competing in the 19th edition of the Surfing NZ Billabong grom series.

The series contained three events across the East and West Coast's of the North Island and this year had even more importance placed on it with NZ National Team spots up for grabs for the ISA World Junior Surfing Games being held in May in El Salvador.

In the first event at the Mount in small but contestable waves, it was Pia Rogers (WHA) and Chloe Groube (Pauanui) who surfed their way to the finals in the U18 and U16 girls divisions respectively, while Manu Roberts (Tairua) in the U18 boys, Harrison Biddle (Onemana) in the U16 boys and Lola Groube (Pauanui) and India Kennings (WHA) in the U16 girls all made it to the semi-finals.

The second stop was on familiar sands and Whangamatā turned on some great conditions over the two days. With lots on the line, the pressure was on to perform and there were some great performances. In the U16 girls, 12 year old Lola Groube took the win with a 13.14 heat score, beating current NZ open women's champ Maya Mateja in the process. In the same division Chloe Groube and India Kennings both made the semis. In a very competitive U18 boys division Ezekiel Wyper (Tairua) made the semis, with Bella Biddle (Onemana) also making the semis of the U14 girls in her first national event. Pia Rogers claimed a second straight final with a 2nd place to Leia Miller who has been based at the Whangamata Area School

Surf Academy. In the U16 boys the pressure was on for placings and Harrison Biddle made it through to the final of the event, while Jay Tingle (Pauanui) surfed to his first semi-final in a national event.

With everything on the line competitors descended on Piha for the final stop with extra qualification points on the line in the 3000 point rated event. It was a weekend of two halves, with Saturday providing picture perfect weather and fun waves while finals day on Sunday brought rain, wind and very tricky on-shore conditions. Harrison Biddle surfed aggressively through the rounds, making the most of the conditions on offer, finishing 2nd in the final and ultimately taking 2nd in the overall series. In the same U16 division, Jay Tingle again featured in the semis, marking a breakthrough for him after impressing in free surfs for some time. In the U18 boys it was Ash Rogers (WHA) who surfed to his best result in several events finishing 3rd in a very tough division which will give him a lot of confidence going forward. In the U16 girls, India Kennings and Chloe Groube both finished as semifinalists marking a consistent series for them both.

Lola Groube and Harrison Biddle, both with overall 2nd placings in the series also gained selection to the NZ team for the upcoming ISA World Surfing Games to be held in El Salvador from 03rd - 12th May, which is a great achievement and shows the future is very bright in our surfing community.

No doubt we have all seen these kids out in all sorts of conditions over the Summer training and practicing and it's great to see this hard work paying off for our local talent.
